Pass Resolutions on Death of Judge C. Debaillon. Court Adjourns.

Tuesday, March 5th, 1907. Court met this day, present Hon. Phillip S. Pugh, Judge presiding; Louis Lacoste, Sheriff, and J. Gilbert St. Julien, Deputy Clerk of Court being in attendance.

IN MEMORIAM:

Expressions commemorative of the memory of the late Judge Conrad Debaillon were made by members of the local bar and by his honor, to the judge presiding, and a committee was appointed draw resolutions and the said committee submitted the following:

To the Hon. the Eighteenth Judicial District Court in and for the Parish of Lafayette, La.:

We the undersigned Committee of the Bar, appointed by this Hon. Court to draft resolutions commemorative of the late ex-judge Conrad Debaillon, beg leave to submit the following:

Whereas, it has pleased an All-Wise Providence to call from the scene of his usefulness, our late friend, ex-judge and jurist and fellow-citizen, the Honorable Conrad Debaillon, a member of this Bar. A man who in all his actions was generous to his opponents and true to his friends and fellow-citizens, broad of intellect and kindly of heart, one of great civic pride and ever in the front rank, battling for the well-being and advancement of his State, parish and town. A man of whom each and every member of this Bar may well say with heartfelt affection: "Take him all in all, we never shall see his like again, as a man, a jurist and a judge."

Therefore, be it resolved, that in the death of Hon. ex-judge Conrad Debaillon, the State of Louisiana, the Parish of Lafayette and the town of Lafayette lose a true and earnest and devoted man and friend, whose works and words will live after him and whose place in the ranks as a member of the bar was ever faithful for the upbuilding of our commonwealth.

Be it further resolved, That we the members of this bar and the committee appointed by your Honor, in the name of and for the whole people of the community, tender to his bereaved family our heartfelt sympathy in this their hour of affliction and irreparable loss, and by these resolutions testify our earnest and deep regret for the loss of the Honorable Conrad Debaillon.

And be it further resolved, That we ask the Honorable Court to order these resolutions spread on the minutes of this Court and that a copy thereof be sent to the family of the deceased, to the New Orleans press, to the local press of this town and to the press of the Parishes of Acadia, and Vermilion, Louisiana.

And be it further resolved that this Court do stand adjourned this day in memory of the late ex-judge Conrad Debaillon,


