Please allow me space in your paper to record my approval and endorsement of the action of our City Council in the almost unanimous vote in favor of the Anti-gambling Ordinance (being only one vote against the same.)

While to some of our people the ordinance may appear too broad and sweeping in that it cuts off all playing of cards for prizes, and what is termed gentlemen gambling, at the same time we must remember that the Council could not well draw the line of discrimination between this kind and allow the other to go free.

I think the Council should have the moral support of all good citizens in the passage of this ordinance and others that I understand they contemplate passing looking to the good of our town. Without this support of the good citizens of the town it will be much harder for the Council to have the ordinance enforced.

And if the other incorpor-

ated towns of the parish and the Police Jury also would pass similar ordinances the whole parish would reap an untold benefit from them.
