Automatic Doctors.

Amsterdam now boasts of automatic doctors. The machine represents a man and in the region of each organ is a slot designed to receive a 15-centime piece—3 cents. The patient suffering drops his coin into the slot and without delay a prescription is shot out bearing the address of an apothecary, whither he takes his card and receives his medicine.

Improved Electric Arc Lamp.

In a new form of electric arc lamp the carbons are formed and supplied as consumed. The lamp is provided with two receptacles in which the plastic material is placed and this is fed through tubes to form the two electrodes of the arc. The ends of the electrodes are baked by means of electric heating coils and the process is a continuous one.


