A good many people who went to see "Three Weeks" at Byers Tuesday evening expecting to see a salacious play were a bit disappointed. A small number who were ignorant of the odorous reputation of the book of the same name, were very well satisfied. They went expecting to see a good play. "Three Weeks" is a good play and the dramatists considerably left out a few overdrawn scenes which made the book a bad among Fort Worth Women at the time of publication. Nearly everyone read it and for a time local humor descended to the depths of a Latin-American jest and laughs hinged on the numeral "21 days."

**Suggestions for January Planting.**  
During this month sow in the vegetable garden, mustard, spinach, carrots, beets, turnips, leeks and early radishes. Sow in a frame so as to protect from the cold, lettuce, endive, cabbage, broccoli, kohlrabi, chervil, parsley and celery. In your hot bed sow egg plants, peppers and tomatoes. Plant peas for general crop. Towards the end of the month plant small varieties such as first and best and Early Alaska. Transplant shallots and set out onion sets. It is better to sow onion seeds in February than in this month.—Moss Pharmacy.


