CITY COUNCIL

Lafayette, La., May 15, 1913.
A special meeting of the City Council was held this day with Mayor Trahan presiding, Messrs. Caffery, Jeanmard, Montgomery, Vigneaux, and Krauss, present and Jagon and Boudreaux absent.
The Mayor stated that the purpose of this meeting was to receive a partial report from the auditors who recently checked the city's books and for such other business as may come up before the Council.
Whereupon Mr. Jeanmard submitted said partial report to the Council which was accepted by it, and the Finance Committee instructed to proceed as he thought best with the collection of delinquent shown thereon.
Plans and specifications for the erection of an office building by Mrs. Gus. Lacoste on Jefferson street were then submitted to the Council; and the Council being of the opinion that a building constructed in accordance therewith granted permission to Mrs. Lacoste to build accordingly.
Moved, seconded and carried that the Mayor require a \$2500 bond from Harold Raymond, engineer, for the faithful performance of his duties as Supervising Engineer for the construction of the new plant, the premium to be paid by Mr. Raymond.
Moved, seconded and carried that warrant issue to John Vigneaux for the sum of \$12.00 for burial of pauper.
There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held this day with Mayor Trahan presiding, Messrs. Boudreaux, Caffery, Krauss, Jeanmard, Montgomery and Vigneaux, present and Jagon absent.
Moved, seconded and carried that the minutes of the previous meetings of the Council be approved as read.
At the request of the Chief of the Fire Department, Gus Schmulen, present before the council, it was moved, seconded and carried, that a committee be appointed to purchase some fire hose and to order the same. The Mayor appointed Montgomery and Jeanmard.
The report of the Treasurer showing a balance to the credit of the General Fund of \$35.47, Special Fund \$3218.99, Railroad Tax Fund one hundred and thirty-five 18-109 dollars, Water and Light Fund \$132.31, Water Main Extension Fund \$158.27, Local Improvement Fund \$409.40, and Water and Light Security Deposit Fund \$138.40, was read to the Council, accepted and ordered.
