JUDGE CAMPBELL'S RULINGS SUSTAINED.

The Supreme Court has affirmed the decision rendered by the jury in the Acadia District Court which convicted Dora Murff of manslaughter for her part in the killing of her former sweetheart, J. M. Delhaye, on Oct. 15, 1913, and for which Judge Campbell sentenced her to the State Penitentiary for four years.

The court's decision also applies in the case of her step-father, James Duvall, convicted of the same crime and sentenced to the penitentiary for life.
