THE PLATFORM OF THE Democratic National Convention.

ADOPTED JULY 7, 1868. The Democratic party, in national convention assembled, reposing its trust in the intelligence, patriotism and discriminating justice of the people...

First—In the restoration of all the States to their rights in the Union under the Constitution and of civil government to the American people. Second—Amnesty for all the past political offenses...

Ninth—The restoration of the rights of the colored people to the full enjoyment of the rights of citizenship, and the maintenance of the rights of the colored people against the usurpations of Congress...
