Proceedings of the Police Jury

Parish of St. John the Baptist. Thursday, February 6, 1913. The Police Jury met this day in regular monthly session with the Hon. A. Lasseigne in the chair and the following members present: Messrs. Le Brun, Bourgeois, Barre and Nagel. Absent: Mr. Scherzneydre. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The finance committee reported favorably upon the following bills, which were ordered paid:

Be it further resolved that the franchise to operate said Ferry be sold subject to the conditions and specifications and under the different bonds heretofore required. Be it further resolved that the successful bidder or bidders bind himself or themselves to purchase the boat and other property connected with the running of the Ferry and now belonging to Montz & Delaneville, the price to be fixed by three arbitrators. The Committee, appointed to investigate the damage done to Mr. A. Lasseigne's property, reported that in their opinion, One hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$160.) would cover same. The Jury accepted the report and ordered the Secretary to write out a voucher for that amount. Adopted unanimously. It was moved by Mr. Nagel and seconded by Mr. Barre that the Police Jury appropriate the sum of Seventy-five (\$75.) Dollars monthly to cover the expenses of the Clerk of Court's office. A vote being called, resulted as follows: Yea, Nagel, Bourgeois, Barre, LeBrun and Lasseigne, Nays, none Adopted. There being no further business, on motion duly seconded the Jury adjourned. Special Notice to Hunters.

The attention of Hunters throughout the parish of St. John the Baptist is called to section 2 of Act No. 209, of the State Legislature, which follows: "Be it further enacted, etc., That no person at any time of the year shall pursue, take, wound or kill in any manner, number or quantity any fish, birds, or wild quadrupeds protected by Law, or buy, sell, offer or expose the same or any part thereof for sale, transport or have the same in possession except as permitted by Law; water fowl protected by this law shall only be taken between the hours of one hour before sunrise and up to midday unless by consent of the Conservation Commission permission be granted for passes shooting to begin not earlier than one-half hour before sunset and to extend to not later than one half hour after sunset, said consent to be withdrawn if the Police Jury objects to the issuance of same. All other game birds shall only be taken in the day
