Reporting three hours later, and
and said to be thirty miles

day at dusk, struck and instant-
ly killed Eli Bergeron, aged 50,

ter, at Patterson, La.

The family had just moved
into a new residence near the S.
P. railroad, and the little daugh-
ter was walking down the track
crossing. The father heard
the approaching fast train, dash-
ed upon the track to rescue his
little girl and had her in his arms
when the engine struck them,
mutilating both more than 35 feet
into the air.

The crushed, frightfully
mangled bodies were picked up
and carried to the hospital.

Bergeron, the mother,
was standing on the gallery of
the house and witnessed the ac-
cident. She became hysterical,
and surrounded by her five other
children, presented a pitiful scene.
The dead father was a native of
Canada and was engaged in
the blacksmith business in Pat-
terson, for several years.

The funeral was held in
Patterson last Thursday.
