

For The Bath.

If you do not feel warm after a cold bath you had better not take it, for it is doing you no good. We do not take cold baths for the sake of cleanliness. We plunge into cold water solely for its invigorating effect, from it we had better seek the invigoration in some other way. Cold water suddenly drives the blood from the skin by constricting the capillaries. It also administers a light shock to the nerves, which has an awakening effect upon all the muscles of the body.

The capillaries being closed, the resistance of the blood to the heart pressure is greater. The heart responds to this resistance by greater effort; it beats more rapidly and with stronger force. The blood surges through the body more swiftly and forces its way through the capillaries as soon as the cold that has closed them is with drawn. This causes the glow of reaction after the cold bath.

When this reaction follows immediately the bath is stimulating; it has done you good and has exercised the system in resistance to cold. If you remain shivery and pale for an hour after the bath cut this out.

It is a mistake to get into a bath by standing in the cold water and hesitating before taking the plunge for this drives the blood up toward the head and is likely to cause congestion of the blood vessels of the throat. The best way is to stand in an empty bath tub and then turn on the shower, so that the cold water will strike the head or shoulders first.

If there be no shower bath, wouse the head and neck first with a sponge or duck the head under water, then get in and plunge the whole body under as quickly as possible. Another mistake is to stay too long. Generally speaking one good plunge is enough. Of course, in summer time one may remain as long as the cold water feels really pleasant.

After the bath it is well to rub the skin briefly with rough towels to help in the return of the surface circulation. Vigorous exercise is also good after a bath.

GAME LAWS.

The following named game is permitted to be killed during the season hereon ONLY.

Doves, Wood Ducks, Sept. 1, to Mch. 1.
River and Sea Ducks, Geese, Brandt, Ralls, Poule D'eau, Gallinules, Tatlers, Curlew and Plover, Oct. 1, to Mch. 1.
Wild Turkey, (Cocks only) Nov. 15, to April 1.
Teal Ducks, Snipe Sand Pipers, Sept. 1, to April 1.
Florida Ducks or Black Mallard, Aug. 1, to March 1.
Papabotte, Plover, chorooks, July 1, to April 1.
Woodcock, Nov. 15, to Feb. 1.
Red Wing Black Bird, all the year round.
Quail, November 15, to March 1.
Sea Gulls, August 1, to February 1.
Prairie Chickens, Killdeer, Pheasants and Wild Turkey Hens, not allowed to be killed or had in possession until December 1915.

The following game birds only are permitted by law to be bought and sold: Wild Sea and River Ducks, Coots or Poule D'eau, Snipe, Geese, Brant and Ralls and these only during the open season for hunting these birds.

BAG LIMITS

Professional hunters or those having market hunter's license allowed not to kill exceeding 25 ducks in one day.
Non-professional hunters allowed to kill not exceeding 25 Ducks, Poule D'eau, Chorooks or Doves, or 50 Snipe or 15 of any other game birds in any one day during the open season.

SQUIRRELS

Open season begins Oct 1st Feb 15 Sale permitted in open season bag limit 15.

FUR BEARING ANIMALS.

One season begins November 1st and ends February 15th. Mink, Otter, Muskrat, Raccoon and Bear.
DEER
North Louisiana, above the lower line of Vernon, Rapides, Avoyelles and Concordia Parishes Open season begins September 15th and ends January 15th.
South Louisiana, below the lower line of Vernon, Rapides, Avoyelles and Concordia Parishes and all that part of the State South of the Mississippi State Line.

On this day the Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. John the Baptist met in regular session with all members present excepting Mr. Gondron. The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and on motion of Mr. Alexandre, seconded by Mr. Madere, they were approved as read.

Moved by Mr. Lager, seconded by Mr. Laurent and carried, the following resolution was adopted and ordered spread upon the minutes:

"Whereas, Mr. E. J. Cairé has, by his personal endorsement on notes issued by this Board and held by the New Orleans National Bank, enabled this Board to properly finance its affairs until the collection of taxes in January, therefore, Be it Resolved by the Board of Directors of the Parish of St. John the Baptist, that it be and it is the duty of the Board to obtain in previous manner, the closing of the school for the year 1914 to be observed again this year. In connection with this resolution the Board wishes it understood that this action is being taken not in deference to any particular sectarian religious feast but owing to the fact that on that particular day nine tenths of the school children fail to attend school.

Moved by Mr. Laurent seconded by Mr. Madere, and carried, the schools of the parish are ordered closed for the Christmas holidays from noon Wednesday the 23rd day of December 1914 to the regular hour of opening classes on Monday January the 4th, 1915.

Received from A. Nagel the sum of forty five cents for the old stove removed from the Court House. Said sum was turned over to the Treasurer.

Moved by Mr. Songy seconded by Mr. LeBrun, that the sheriff be authorized to issue to Mr. Marcelin Trégre of the third ward a license for a Bar Room for whites according to Law.

Offered by LeBrun and seconded by Mr. Songy that the license for the year 1915 be as follows:

(Section 1) That there is hereby levied an annual license tax for the Parish of St. John the Baptist for the year 1915 upon each persons association of persons or business firms and corporations pursuing any trade, profession vocation calling or business conducted pursued carried on or operated within the limits of this Parish of St. John the Baptist La. which may be subject to such license tax under article 229 of the constitution of the state of La.

(Section 2) That the annual Parish license hereby levied is hereby declared to be the same as to graduation and one half in amount as the license laws of the state of La. now in force provided for the state purposes and are to be determined in accordance herewith to wit:

Act 171 of the General assembly of the state of La. of the session of 1898 and the subsequent act of the General Assembly of La, except as herein after provided.

It is hereby declared to the institution of the body to herein levy the same license law for parochial purposes as to graduation and one half as to amount as is now imposed by the General assembly for state purposes to which laws special reference is hereby made as being part hereof for the purposes aforesaid except as herein provided.

Be it further ordained that from and after the adoption of this ordinance the tax collected shall begin to collect from each of the persons or business firms association of persons and corporations pursuing within the limits of said Parish any trade profession calling vocation or business, a license tax as herein provided, all licenses shall be due and collectible during the first two months of each year, and all unpaid licenses shall become delinquent on the first day of March each year and all firms who announce business after that date shall become delinquent unless the license is paid within ten days.

(Section 3) That whenever any distilled Malt Vinous or other kind of mixed liquors shall be sold in connection with the business of grocery retail merchant restaurant oyster house confectionery or druggist in less quantities than five gallons.

The license for such additional business shall be five hundred dollars.
(Section 4) That for every business of bar room Cabaret coffee house, beer saloon liquors exchange drinking saloon grogshop beer house beer garden or any other place where any thing to be drunk or eaten in the premises is sold directly or indirectly the license shall be and the sum is declared to be five hundred dollars.

(Section 5) That for all travelling show giving performances in the Parish a tax of Twenty five dollars a year shall be paid for each and every such show.
(Section 6) That for the business of peddling and hawking the license shall be and is graded as follows.

Peddling on foot.....	\$ 5.
" " " " Horse Back.....	10.00
" " " " Vehicle.....	10.00
" " " " 2 " ".....	25.00
" " " " Automobile.....	25.00
" " " " Boats Luggars Skiff or other water craft.....	25.00

(Section 7) Be it further ordained etc that the procedure in the collection of parochial licenses herein levied and that to ascertain the amount due for same by the tax collector shall be the same as is now provided by law for state purposes and particularly in act 171 of the General assembly of the state of La. of the session of 1898 as amended by subsequent acts, of the General assembly and at subsequent session and the penalties imposed upon and interest and cost to be collected from delinquent are declared to be the same and to be collected in the same manner as provided by said act of the General assembly as amended by subsequent acts for state purposes.

(Section 8) Be it further ordained etc that the parochial licenses which are herein levied are declared to be for the purposes which may be required by the constitution and laws of this state for parochial purposes. Adopted.

There being no further business on motion duly seconded, the Jury adjourned.
