CRIMEAN FORCES OF WRANGEL DEFEATED

Armenia Cut off From World By Turk Nationalists—Capital Emptied.

Paris—Sebastopol has fallen, the Russian bolsheviki having occupied the city Sunday night, according to information received by the French foreign office.

The bolsheviki are reported to be masters of the whole Crimean peninsula.

General Wrangel, members of his staff and M. Martel, French high commissioner at Sebastopol, were taken on board the French warship Waldeck Rosseau.

The Waldeck Rosseau and the other French and the American and British ships at Sebastopol did not leave that port until the bolsheviki were within the walls of the city. These ships, according to the foreign office advices, were loaded to capacity with refugees and the remnants of General Wrangel's troops. Many refugees, however, were left behind, and these, it was said, probably numbered 100,000.

The fate of these refugees is causing great anxiety, as the American relief organization also has left the Crimea. The majority of the refugees have been dependent upon the American relief workers for their sustenance, and the hope was expressed that means might be devised by which that organization would continue its work.

The reports indicated that only a few of General Wrangel's staff had managed to escape. The staff as a whole, it was said, had been virtually wiped out, its members either being killed or taken prisoner.

Erivan, capital of the Armenian republic, has been evacuated. Communications between the great railway junction of Alexandropol and Tiflis, capital of Georgia, have been cut, completely isolating Armenia from the outside world by the Turks, and the road from Ardahan to Ardanaucht is swarming with Armenian women and children fleeing down the valley of the Tchokorok River towards Batum, according to cabled dispatches received by the headquarters of the Near East Relief in New York Monday.

At the same time reports were received that Mustapha Kemal Pasha in person is at the head of the Turkish nationalist forces operating against Armenia, and has ordered the Georgian government to evacuate Batum, on the Black Sea, and that the Georgian army has been mobilized to defend that port.

A cable message from Mrs. Veronica Harris of Santa Cruz, Cal., temporary head of the Near East Relief work at Tiflis, says:

"Following official communication received from the commandant of the forces of the Armenian republic November 8:

"The military commander of the Armenian republic was obliged to send part of our troops operating against the Turks in the region of Alexandropol against the Tartars who were acting in our rear at Mount Ag-Baba. These circumstances made necessary negotiations, the result of what was temporary armistice (with the Turks) from November."

"The French mission in Tiflis reports Alexandropol taken. Have no news from Alexandropol or Kara, but all Americans believed to be safe. Communications between Alexandropol and Tiflis cut indefinitely.

Cable dispatches reaching the Near East Relief headquarters Friday from Captain Sergt Bekzetian, Armenian diplomatic representative in Tiflis, stated that the remnants of the Armenian army retreating from Alexandropol had withdrawn directly northward along the ArpaChai (Barley River) into the Georgian province of Akhalkalaki. One hundred thousand refugees were said to have fled before the Turks across the frontiers of Armenia into Georgia, as well as into the interior of Armenia. The cablegram said these refugees were without food, clothing or shelter, and that the country into which they had fled was barren of supplies.

Charles V. Vickery, general secretary of the Near East Relief, said Monday that cargoes were now on the seas bound for Batum, consisting of 5,813,000 cases and bales of old clothing and shoes; 5220 bags of rice, 1680 bags of sugar, and 260 tons of soap and other supplies. The boat, Gul Djemal, leaving New York November 20, will carry 1000 tons of wheat flour, 400 tons of rice and 100 tons of sugar for relief purposes in the stricken districts.
