

Big Knights of Columbus Initiation at Edgard May 29

Official Proceedings

School Board

Parish of St. John the Baptist.

Edgard, La., May 5 1921.

The School Board assembled this day in regular monthly session with President E. O. Abadie in the Chair, and the following members present: Messrs. Alexander, Bourgeois, Tassin, Absent, Messrs. Gendron and Millet.

The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting and on motion of Mr. Tassin, seconded by Mr. Bourgeois, and carried, they were approved as read.

The Superintendent reported that Messrs. Geo. J. Deynoodt & Son had accepted the offer of the Board in the amount of \$660.77 for extra work done on the Leon Godchaux High School building and that he had sent them a check in final settlement of the matter.

The Superintendent reported that the School Rally held on Saturday, April 23, was successful in every detail and that the gate receipts amounting to \$117.95 were used to defray the expenses of the Rally.

The Superintendent reported that the funds of the Board had become exhausted due to expenses incurred in the building additions to the Garyville, Godchaux, and Ory Schools. On motion of Mr. Tassin, seconded by Mr. Alexander, and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the funds of the Board have become exhausted due to expenses that were absolutely necessary and—

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Board that the children of this Parish should have nine months school, and—

WHEREAS, it is possible to borrow on the 1 1/2 mill special tax which the good citizens of this Parish have voted for the education of their children, THEREFORE—

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President of this Board be and he is hereby authorized to sign and negotiate with any bank or banker, a note or notes, for a sufficient sum of money to operate the schools of this Parish for the remainder of the school year.

It was moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Bourgeois, and carried that the schools be closed on the 27th. day of May.

The following bills were approved by the Finance Committee and on motion of Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Tassin, and carried, they were ordered paid:

POLICE JURY

Parish of St. John the Baptist

Edgard La., May 5, 1921.

The Police Jury met this day in regular session with the Hon. P. G. Songy in the Chair and the following members present: Messrs. Reynaud, Barre, Montegut and Duhe. Absent, Mr. Bourgeois.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and on motion of Mr. Barre, seconded by Mr. Duhe, said minutes were approved as read.

The Finance Committee's report showing an amount of \$2,101.49 for bills incurred during April, and an amount of \$5,000.00 on account to Mr. Antoine Haydel on Good Road contract, making a total of \$7,101.49, was read and on motion of Mr. Reynaud seconded by Mr. Montegut, said report was accepted and said bills were ordered paid.

The Report of the Parish Treasurer showing the following Cash balances on May 1st:

General Fund \$3,170.73; Sheriff's Salary Fund \$5,784.15; Special Good Road Fund \$14,070.83; Assessor's Salary Fund 10 Cents, was read, and on motion of Mr. Barre, seconded by Mr. Duhe, said report was accepted.

There being insufficient fund in the treasury to meet the bills as reported by the Finance Committee; it was moved by Mr. Duhe, seconded by Mr. Reynaud, that the President be and is hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of St. John the sum of Four Thousand Dollars to meet said bills.

It was moved by Mr. Barre and seconded by Mr. Duhe that the following Resolution be adopted:

Whereas, this Police Juryaft er due efforts has been unable to collect from the State Highway Department, the sum of \$21 610.98 due this Parish on the Good Roads built under state supervision, ,

Be it Resolved that the District Attorney, Hon. C. A. Buchler be and is hereby authorized and directed to take the necessary legal steps to force payment of this amount of \$21,610.98 due by said State Highway Department to the said Parish of St. John the Baptist. Vote on same resulted as follows:

Yeas: Reynaud, Barre, Songy, Montegut and Duhe. Absent—Mr. Bourgeois.

It was moved by Mr. Montegut, and seconded by Mr. Reynaud that the following Resolution be adopted:

Whereas the public road in front of Mr. A. M. Montz in the fourth ward is not of the width as required by the State Highway Department, and whereas there is at said point a fence obstructing said road, and whereas due efforts have been made to have Mr. Montz remove this obstruction and whereas said efforts have failed, and whereas further this obstruction in said road is a public menace

Be it Resolved, That the District Attorney, Hon. C. A. Buchler, be and is hereby authorized and directed to take the proper legal steps towards having said obstruction removed with the least possible delay.

Vote on same resulted as follows: Yeas: Messrs. Reynaud, Barre, Songy, Montegut and Duhe. Absent, Mr. Bourgeois.

The bill of Mr. E. Z. Cazenave for \$100.31 reported without action by the Finance Committee was received and on motion of Mr. Duhe, seconded by Mr. Reynaud, said bill was approved for payment at the next Police Jury Meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Barre, and seconded by Mr. Duhe and carried that official notice be given to the Vache-re Wholesale Grocery Co. that their trucks are not equipped with warning signals and that their drivers are violating the speed laws of this parish, and that this reckless driving must be stopped at once.

It was moved by Mr. Montegut seconded by Mr. Barre and carried that official notice is hereby given to all auto drivers to heed the parish laws requiring automobiles and trucks to travel no faster than 25 miles per hour on a straight road and 8 miles per hour when making curves, and to slow their horns at all curves, and to observe traffic laws requiring every one to keep to his right.

It was moved by Mr. Duhe, seconded by Mr. Reynaud and carried that the secretary be and is hereby directed to notify Messrs. John Wallace, Pierre Schneider and others that the law requires that gates be erected at all lanes leading to and from the public highway, and that said gates be kept closed.

It was moved by Mr. Duhe, seconded by Mr. Montegut and carried that official notice is given to all pound keepers to enforce the law forbidding the roaming of cattle on the highway between sunset and sunrise.
