

WASHINGTON LETTER.

Washington, June 22nd, 1885. An eminent French Statesman when asked how he accomplished such a prodigious amount of work each day, replied "by doing one thing after another."

It is to be feared that in the discussion of appointments to office, the great and silent reform work, which the new administration is carrying on may be overlooked.

Hon. Geo. Jelks who has just been appointed assistant Secretary of the Interior and given special charge of all cases for the forfeiture of land grants, shows that this work is to be undertaken in no half-hearted way.

Mr. Whitney, the new Secretary of the Navy is steadily growing in popularity with good men of all parties. Both the Navy and the country hail him as a deliverer from the regime of rings and corruption that has preyed upon the country since the war and left our coasts in a defenseless condition.

The action of the Post Master General regarding the Pacific Mail steamship subsidy is very significant. It will be remembered that the Republican majority in the Senate forced the passage of a bill giving \$400,000 to the Pacific steamship company for carrying the mails.
