

No CONFISCATION.—Speaking of a violent newspaper in favor of confiscating Southern property, the New York Times says:

The effect of writings of this character cannot but be mischievous. It introduces a new element of uncertainty into the South, intensifies its industrial paralysis, and heightens the distrust which already deters capitalists from embarking in its enterprise. It shows that, in the opinion of politicians who claim a peculiar right to manage affairs, and a peculiar influence over Congressional action, a sweeping measure of confiscation is in itself righteous, and should be pressed upon the country. The real feeling of the people is that no more should be done as against the South than is needed in the interests of the Union; that there should be no more vindictive penalties, no harsh proscription; and the Republican party, potent though it be, cannot afford to ignore the fact.
