

Too Good to be Lost.—An old preacher in Western New York, who was being persuaded by some of his churchmen, during the political excitement in that State, last fall, to join the Radical party, said:
"No, my brethren, can't join that party, because all the abolitionists in the country are in it; and abolitionism, my brethren, has done a wonderful sight of harm among the people. It has hurt many shepherds and scattered many flocks. It has got into the Methodist church and broke that up. It got in among the Presbyterians and split them in two; and it got into the Government and broke the old Union to pieces. And, my brethren, I do not know of anything it is good for but to break down and break up. And if you have any enmity at all against the old boy, I advise you to send abolitionism into his dominions, and it will break up hell itself in less than two weeks."

A correspondent of the Carroll Record tells about a man born and raised in that parish who was the chief of a company of guerrillas or cut-throats—outlawed by both Federal and Confederate—having been arrested and well nigh losing his life, (but for the interposition and endeavors of those whom he now denounces) at the hands of his fellow-rebels, for stealing and selling four negro children, taken by him from the plantation of Mr. Spencer, in Bench's Bend, who is going about the parish making Radical speeches to the freedmen, arraying the black man against the white, and making numberless false charges against the latter. He gives the freedmen to understand that he is their friend. That he will see that they are protected in voting at all hazards. That he will have a regiment of troops on hand to protect them, if necessary. He tells them not to believe anything which comes not from a Radical—and, lastly, he says that he is a Radical himself!
