### CHARTER of the BANK OF ADDIS

State of Louisiana, Parish of West Baton Rouge. BE IT KNOWN, That on this 13th day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, before me, ADOLF GWINN, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of West Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereinafter mentioned and hereunto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana, as such laws are provided, they have covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents covenant, agree and bind themselves as well as all such persons as may hereafter become associated with them, under the following articles, to-wit:

#### ARTICLE I.

The name hereby assumed to distinguish this banking corporation is "The Bank of Addis".

#### ARTICLE II.

This association shall have and possess all the powers granted to banking associations under the provisions of the laws of this State, and especially of Act 179 of the Acts of 1902, as amended to date.

#### ARTICLE III.

The banking business of this association is to be carried on in the Village of Addis, Parish of West Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where its domicile is hereby established.

#### ARTICLE IV.

All citations or other legal process shall be served upon the President of said corporation, and in his absence, upon the Cashier of said corporation or association.

#### ARTICLE V.

The amount of the capital stock of this bank is fixed at Twenty Thousand (\$20,000) Dollars, divided into four hundred shares of a par value of fifty dollars each, which capital stock may be increased to any amount upon complying with the requirements of the law; and this corporation shall be organized with a surplus of Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars, which shall be paid in by the several subscribers to the capital stock, each of which said subscribers shall pay in cash the sum of Seventy-Five (\$75) Dollars for each share of stock for which he may subscribe, fifty dollars of which is to be credited to the capital stock and twenty-five dollars of which is to be applied to the creation of said surplus.

#### ARTICLE VI.

#### ARTICLE VII.

The capital stock and surplus shall be paid in accordance with law, and this corporation shall commence business on January 1st, 1920.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

This corporation shall have and enjoy succession by its corporate name, and shall continue fifty years from and after the date hereof.

#### ARTICLE IX.

The corporate powers of this bank shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Directors consisting of nine persons, and the following regulations apply to the Board of Directors, and shall hold office until the Second Tuesday of January, 1921, and until their successors shall have been elected, to-wit: S. A. Levert, F. E. Hebert, W. C. Myhand, L. M. Morley, Joe Gottlieb, A. C. Branham, Wm. Gassie, Jr., P. K. Foret and C. P. Dupuy. The Board of Directors shall be elected annually on the Second Tuesday of January for each year, except the first board of Directors appointed in this Charter to serve until the second Tuesday of January, 1921. Notice of such election shall be given not less than ten days prior to such election by posting notice of same in the lobby of said bank, and by such publication as may be required by law; and the Board of Directors shall appoint one or more stockholders to preside at such elections as commissioners. All such elections shall be by ballot and every holder of stock shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock registered in his name on the books of the corporation, to be cast in person or by proxy, and the majority of votes cast shall elect.

Any vacancy occurring among the Directors shall be filled by election for the remainder of the term of the Board by the remaining Directors. Five Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business, and their decision shall be valid corporate acts.

The first board of Directors named in this Charter, immediately upon the organization of this corporation, and the Board of Directors thereafter elected, shall elect from their own number, by ballot, a president, one or more vice presidents, and a cashier.

The said Board of Directors may elect or appoint such officers, agents, employees, servants and clerks as it may deem necessary for the conducting of the business of said corporation; fix their compensation, term of service, with the right to dismiss them at said Board's pleasure; and the said Board shall have the right to fix and determine the salaries of the several officers herein provided for.

The said Board may make and establish as well as alter and amend any and all by-laws necessary for the conduct of the business of said corporation, which of the corporate powers of this corporation are hereby vested in the said Board of Directors, except those especially reserved by law and by this Charter to the stockholders. The cashier elected by the Board of Directors, shall be the custodian of the seal of the corporation, which shall be circular in form, with the name of the incorporation and the words, "Addis, La."

#### ARTICLE X.

In case of dissolution or termination of this corporation, either by limitation of its charter or from any cause, its affairs shall be liquidated by three stockholders to be appointed at a general meeting to be convened for that purpose by publication for fifteen days in a newspaper published in the Parish of West Baton Rouge, and a majority of the stock voting at such election shall be requisite to elect. Said stockholders shall remain in office until the affairs of said corporation shall have been fully liquidated. In case of the death of one or more of the said commissioners, the vacancy shall be filled by election by the stockholders.

#### ARTICLE XI.

This Charter may be changed, modified or amended, the capital stock increased or decreased in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, with the assent of two-thirds of the entire capital stock represented at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for such purpose, and after due notice shall be given in one or more newspapers published in the Parish of West Baton Rouge, five days preceding the meeting, and by the assent of each stockholder mailed to him in notice to each stockholder mailed to him in notice to each stockholder.


