He was suffering from the effect of a fit of epilepsy, which occurred in the middle of February. The first time I called at his residence I was not permitted to see him; but in a few days I received a polite note for him at the hand of a servant, who was a native of America, and this Byron was kind to, and proud of, to the last.

On the evening of the 17th of April, he opened his fine eye for the last time, and closed it forever, without the appearance of pain. "O my God!" exclaimed the kind Fletcher, "I fear my master is gone!" The doctors then felt his pulse, and said, "you are right—he is gone."
