START NEW GOLF COURSE AT COLONIAL COUNTRY CLUB

Plans for 3,225-Yard Links Accepted by Club and Funds for Its Construction Are Raised—New Locker House Will Be Built

At the windup celebration at the Colonial Country Club last evening at which prizes were awarded the winners in the handicap tournament, \$6,000 was subscribed for a new golf course, construction of which will begin immediately.

The new course will be 3,225 yards long, according to plans submitted by G. E. Watt, president of the Elliott-Fisher Co., and C. H. Hunter, of the same company. The plans were accepted. Plans include a new locker house with a capacity of 180. The present locker house will be turned over to the ladies. It was an enthusiastic meeting and in less than an hour the money was subscribed. In addition twenty-five life memberships to the club were sold.

Winners of the tournament were awarded silver loving cups by the golf committee which had charge of the tournament. WANTS \$15,000 PER YEAR

Bresnahan Willing to Manage Cubs Under Three-Year Contract

Chicago, Oct. 20.—Roger Bresnahan is willing to succeed Hank O'Day as manager of the Cubs, providing President Thomas hands him a three-year contract calling for \$15,000 per year.

There is little doubt but that O'Day is done as the Cubs' pilot. No official information has been issued to this effect, but the rumors have been so strong lately that Bresnahan was to be made manager that Roger yesterday gave out his ultimatum to the club. Bresnahan this year drew down \$6,000 as a plain catcher and his boss for an \$8,500 increase to assume the responsibilities as manager is not thought unreasonable here, especially when taking into consideration what a winning ball club can do in this town.

If Bresnahan gets control, there is going to be a general weeding out of undesirables, for Roger knows the insides of the various cliques which rend the Cubs and he will not stand for it and he would likely get rid of every trouble-maker on the team.

ARMY-NAVY GAME WILL BE PLAYED IN PHILADELPHIA

Academies at Last Decide Where Grid-Iron Shall Be Then Sign Agreement—Covering a Period of Five Years—Laying Plans for Game

Philadelphia, Oct. 20.—With the official announcement in Washington yesterday afternoon that the Army-Navy football game will be played at Franklin Field on November 28, the athletic authorities of the University of Pennsylvania immediately began preparing for the event.

Information to the effect that the athletic officials of the two Government institutions had signed a five year agreement was received from Captain Herman J. Koehler, of the Army Athletic Association and Lieutenant Commander A. P. Fairfield of the Naval Academy by E. J. Berlet, chairman of the Philadelphia army and navy committee.

Three of the five games are to be played in this city and the other two in New York. Both Captain Koehler and Lieutenant Fairfield expressed their appreciation of the liberal offer of the Philadelphia American League baseball team relative to the use of Shibe Park for the games and regretted that it will be impossible for them to accept the offer this year.

Through the holding of the game on Franklin Field the Philadelphia committee will be relieved of all responsibility in connection with financing the game, stand construction, ticket distribution, etc. This work now will be done by the authorities of the University of Pennsylvania.

Mr. Berlet expressed his delight with the success of the Philadelphia committee, which has been working earnestly since last December to bring about the return of the game to this city. He announced that the committee probably will be continued to advocate and arrange for the construction of a huge athletic stadium in Philadelphia. The committee expects the co-operation of the University of Pennsylvania in this proposed undertaking.

COLLINS MAY LEAD YANKS

Trade Is Reported by Which Highlanders Get Star Infielder

New York, Oct. 20.—It was learned from a semi-official source here yesterday that Eddie Collins, second baseman and leading batter of the Philadelphia Athletics, will be playing manager of the Yankees next season.

Connie Mack is said to be ready to offer Collins to the Yankees in exchange for an infielder or two, a matter of money and relief from a three years' contract. This move is believed to be the first step in Mack's retrenchment plan. The Athletics, although they were champions of the world, showed a deficit for the season of 1914 and Mack is willing to part with Collins to cut expenses for next year.

If the deal is consummated, Collins will play second base, besides managing the Yanks.
