AMERICANS ORGANIZE FOR THE RELIEF OF BELGIUM IN FOOD CRISIS NOW PENDING

London, Oct. 22, 11.25 P. M. (Delayed in Transmission).—The organization of the American commission for the relief of Belgium was completed.

The Spanish Ambassador at London has been added to the commission and their nationals will assist in the work.

The operations of the committee in the food market have disclosed that, owing to the desire of the British government that the stock of food in these islands should not be depleted by export and to the restrictions placed upon such exports, it is extremely difficult to find even emergency provisions in England.

In Charleroi the food supply is exhausted and the population is subsisting on potato soup.

The commission learns that all foodstuffs from America must come in neutral bottoms.

The commission already has purchased a quarter of a million dollars' worth of foodstuffs in the name of the American Ambassador at London.
