

SERBIA REPORTS AUSTRIAN ATTACKS AS BEING REPULSED
Paris, Nov. 10, 3 A. M.—A dispatch from Nish, Serbia, to the Havas Agency contains the following statement regarding the frontier fighting:

GERMAN WIRELESS CATCHES S. O. S. OF BRITISH STEAMER
New York, Nov. 10.—The Sayville, L. I., wireless plant, which, since the war, has been chiefly conspicuous as the principal German medium of communication with the United States, picked up yesterday afternoon a distress call from a British steamer, the Rembrandt, which sailed from Baltimore for St. Nazaire, France, with 800 French cavalry horses on board.

Boston, Nov. 10.—Twenty submarines for a foreign power, supposed to be England, are to be constructed at the Quincy plant of the Fore River Shipbuilding Company.

FRENCH TROOPS VICTOR IN GERMAN CONGO DISTRICT
Bordeaux, Via Paris, Nov. 10, 4.15 A. M.—It is officially announced here that in the region of the Sanga river in the Congo, French troops, commanded by General Aymerich, succeeded in driving the Germans from the larger part of the territory lost in the 1911 convention.

FEAR ENGLISH AEROPLANE WAS KILLED IN LAST VOYAGE
London, Nov. 10, 1.55 A. M.—Earl Annesley, who left England last Friday by aeroplane, has not since been heard from and it is feared that he has been killed. The Earl was a member of the Royal Flying Corps and has performed valuable services for the allies in the war, notably during the siege of Antwerp.

JAPS, THEY SAY, MAY ALSO HAVE SECRET RADIO PLANT
Washington, Nov. 10.—Japan as well as Germany is believed to be operating a secret wireless station from this country. Evidence secured by representatives of the Navy Department tends to show that agents of the Mikado have established a plant somewhere on the coast of California.

200,000 to Invade Serbia
Bucharest, Via Rome, Nov. 10.—A force of 200,000 men, made up of Austrians and Germans, has concentrated on the Danube, near Orsova. The object is the invasion of Serbia, and for this purpose the force is fully equipped with provisions for bridging the Danube.

Blame War for Failure
Williamsport, Pa., Nov. 10.—The European war is declared to be responsible for the failure of the Eastern Pacific Mills Company, manufacturers of foundry supplies, with plants in this city, Jersey Shore and Antea Fort, whose personal property was sold at Sheriff's sale yesterday.

To Ship Powder to Europe
Pottsville, Pa., Nov. 10.—The powder plant of W. H. Blumenstine, at Mt. Carbon, has been purchased by a syndicate which will use the product to export to Europe. Large contracts have been entered into with one of the governments at war.
