FEDERAL RESERVE BANKS ARE READY

Sec'y McAdoo Signs Formal Order To-day and Great Financial System Is Launched

7,551 BANKS IN THE MEMBERSHIP

They Have an Authorized Capital of \$26,795,000 and One-sixth of That Amount Has Been Called in and Placed in Their Vaults

Washington, Nov. 16.—Secretary McAdoo early to-day signed the formal order announcing that the twelve Federal reserve banks were established and ready for business.

Please accept my cordial congratulations upon the opening of the Federal Reserve bank of your district and my sincere commendation upon the effective work you have done in preparing the bank for business in the short time allowed for the opening.

Regional Bank Centers The regional banks which will serve as centers to provide for the commercial requirements of the country have been established in New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Chicago, Minneapolis, St. Louis, Kansas City, Atlanta, Richmond, Dallas and San Francisco.

The new system are 7,551 member banks, with an authorized capital placed at \$26,795,000. One-sixth of that amount has been called in and placed in their vaults.

Asserting that the opening of the banks marked a new era in the history of the U. S., Secretary McAdoo added: "It is believed that they will put an end to the annual uncertainty from which the country has suffered for the past generation about insufficient money and credit to move the crops each year and will give such stability to banking business that the extreme fluctuations in interest rates and available credits which have characterized banking in the past will be destroyed permanently."

Elasticity to Paper Currency The chief attraction and value of the new system, according to its interpreters, are to be found in the elasticity it will give to recognized paper money.

May Become a World Power "The new banking system wisely administered," said Mr. Warburg, "will prove to be the means, not of inflation, but of safety, independence and gradual, healthy expansion."

Largest Bank Opens for Business New York, Nov. 16.—The Federal Reserve Bank of New York at 62 Cedar street, largest of the twelve regional institutions to operate under the new financial system of the United States, opened for business to-day.

Masked Women

Upper class Swahili women wear curious masks, which are made of leather and beads in a wooden frame. The mask is derived from the traditional usage of Moslem women, who must keep their faces covered in the presence of men. For several centuries Arab traders have frequented this East African coast, and their influence are due most of the civilized customs found to-day among the natives of the district. The clothing worn by these prosperous dames is of silk; their shoes are partly of silver, and they wear much silver jewelry. The Moslems in Zanzibar, by the way, are less fanatically strict about religious usages than their brethren in Morocco and Turkey.—Wide World Magazine.
