FLAMES DESTROY FERRY HOUSE AND LUMBER YARD

Reading Terminal in Camden and Este Plant in Philadelphia, Loss Million 160 Firemen Injured—Negro Porter Probably Perished

Philadelphia, Jan. 4.—Two of the most spectacular fires ever seen in this section of the country swept away more than a million dollars' worth of property in this city and Camden yesterday.

The big ferry terminal of the Reading railway at Kaighn's Point, Camden, through which millions of Philadelphia have passed on their way to the seashore, was burned to the ground by flames which are supposed to have been started by a carelessly discarded cigar butt. Adjoining the ferry house the immense woodworking mill of C. B. Cole's Sons was also destroyed, while dozens of passenger coaches in the terminal sheds were burned to their tracks.

The other fire leveled the large lumber yard of Charles Este Company, on Glenwood avenue, between Nineteenth and Twenty-first streets, this city, also burning out the fronts of a row of houses across the street and scorching dwellings for squares. The fire engine of Company No. 45, which ventured too near the blaze, was also consumed in the flames and left a tangled mass of machinery.

Nearly 100 firemen were overcome by smoke or singed by the flames at the Este fire. A dozen ambulances were on the spot and the doctors and nurses were kept busy for hours treating the injured, none of whom, however, was seriously hurt.

Sixty firemen were also treated at the Camden fire, and it is believed that one man, John C. Brown, of Lawnside, N. J., may have met his death in the blaze, as no trace of him could be found after the fire. Brown was a negro porter at the ferry house.

Both blazes were fanned by high winds and gave the firemen considerable trouble, burning for many hours. The Este fire was still raging last night and is likely to smolder for several days, owing to the immense amount of lumber on fire.

ICE LOCKS SUICIDE IN

Grapples Ask Permission to Use Dynamite to Recover Body. Williamsport, Pa., Jan. 4.—A request was sent to the State Fish Commission yesterday by the city police for permission to dynamite the ice which covers the west branch of the Susquehanna river to secure the body of Luigi Sciacca, who committed suicide Saturday by jumping from the Market street bridge. The body was caught several times yesterday by searchers with grappling hooks, but lost.

NEGRO WAITERS IN DANGER

CATHOLIC CHURCH BURNS

Buildings Valued at More Than \$100,000 Destroyed by Fire

Mount Pleasant, Pa., Jan. 4.—The Slavish Roman Catholic church and school buildings were destroyed by fire yesterday afternoon, entailing a loss estimated at \$100,000. Mrs. Jacob Varin-tock, 67 years old, a member of the church for over a half century, discovered the fire, and, after sounding an alarm through the neighborhood, dropped dead from heart disease caused by the excitement. Another woman faint and is in a critical condition.

TWO RESIDENCES BURNED

Homes in Suburbs of Reading Destroyed by Fire

Reading, Pa., Jan. 4.—Fire of unknown origin completely destroyed the homes of Howard Rickenbach and Mrs. Sallie Strausser, at Hyde Park, a suburb of Reading, early yesterday, entailing a loss of \$4,000.





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
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
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AUSTRIA'S GREAT NAVAL BASE BOMBARDED BY ALLIES' WAR SHIPS.

It is announced from London that more than thirty French and British war ships have bombarded the Austrian harbors of Pola and Rovigno. Pola is the principal naval harbor and arsenal of Austria. It is almost completely landlocked and an extensive system of fortifications defends its entrance. It was a war harbor in the time of the Romans, who conquered it in 178 B. C. The town has a population of 45,000. Rovigno is a thriving place, with 12,000 inhabitants engaged in ship building, the sardine fishery and the production of olive oil and wine.
