Brownsville, June 20, 1867. The corporators and friends of the Monongahela Valley Railroad met here to-day.

The delegates from Greene county volunteered to raise fifteen thousand dollars, and double it if necessary.

The meeting was addressed by Dr. Van Voorhis, of Fayette county, and Drs. Culver and Patton, of Greene.

The meeting was enthusiastic, and argued well for success. The meeting adjourned to meet at Jefferson, Greene county, on the 23d of June.

We apprehend that there must be some mistake about the figures attributed to Greene county, in the above dispatch. If this county only appropriates a Railroad, \$15,000 worth, she has very little comprehension, either of the cost or value of such an institution.
