THE CANDLE FISH.—This is one of the most curious members of the finny tribe. It is caught on the coasts of British Columbia, where it is extremely common, and proves very useful to the natives. Some idea of its marvelous fatness may be gleaned from the fact that the natives use it as a lamp, the light given being very considerable. The fish, when dried, has a piece of rush pith, or a strip from the inner bark of the cypress tree drawn through it, a long needle, made of hard wood, being used for the purpose; it is then lighted, and burns steadily till consumed. Any one can read comfortably by its light.

COURAGE OF SCIENCE.—Courage in the battle-field is celebrated in history and in song, but little is said of the courage exhibited in pursuing scientific investigations, though often displaying more real bravery than was ever called into action in war. It is said that when Arago and Dulong were employed by the French Government to make experiments upon the subject of the construction and safety of steam boilers, the task was one of as much danger as difficulty. The bursting of boilers, to which they were constantly exposed in a limited locality, was more hazardous than that of shells upon a battle-field, for while military officers who assisted them—men of tried courage in the conflict—grew pale, and fled from the scene, the savans proceeded coolly to make their calculations, and to observe the temperature and pressure upon the boilers almost at the very point of explosion.

CROCODILES.—Few creatures, says Sir Samuel Baker, are so sly and wary as the crocodile. I watch them continually as they attack the dense flocks of small birds that throng the bushes at the water's edge. These birds are perfectly aware of the danger, and they fly from the attack if possible. The crocodile then quietly and innocently lies upon the surface, as though it appeared quite by an accident; it thus attracts the attention of the birds, and it slowly sails away a considerable distance, exposed to their view. The birds, thus beguiled by their deceiver, believe that the danger is removed, and they again flock to their bush, and once more dip their thirsty beaks into the stream. I have seen them so absorbed in slaking their thirst that they did not observe that their enemy was no longer on the surface. A sudden splash, followed by a huge pair of jaws beneath the bush that engulfs some dozens of victims, is the signal of the crocodile's return, who has thus slyly dived, and hastened under cover of water to his victims. I have observed the crocodile repeat this maneuver constantly; they deceive by a feigned retreat, and then attack from below.

AFFECTION OF A DOG.—We have frequently heard of one species of the feathery tribe exercising a maternal care over members of an entirely different family, and the instances have been regarded as very remarkable. The idea of a dog voluntarily assuming the protectorship of a brood of chickens, and interesting himself in relieving their necessities, would be deemed preposterous, although the sagacity of the canine race has more than once astonished man. We have before us a curious evidence of the affection of a dog manifested toward a large brood of bantam and guinea chickens at Egg Harbor City, New Jersey. The old hen suddenly died, leaving the brood without any means of subsistence or shelter. As the tender chickens were wandering about the barn-yard in search of food, they came upon a valuable dog that was in the habit of sleeping near the roost in daytime. One by one they nestled around him, and by the warmth of his body were kept alive. On awakening, the dog seemed to appreciate the responsibilities that had developed upon him, and curled himself in a manner that would afford the greatest amount of comfort to the motherless chickens. The guardian has continued to manifest the utmost interest for his charge, scratching the gravel and sand for them, watching them faithfully during the day, and sleeping with them in their roost at night.

THE MOUNTAINS IN THE MOON.—It is an ascertained fact that there are three classes of lunar mountains. The first consists of isolated, separate, distinct mountains of a very curious character. The distinguishing characteristic of these mountains is—they start up from a plain quite suddenly. On the earth it is well-known that mountains generally go in ranges of groups; but we find these isolated lunar mountains standing up entirely apart, never having been connected with any range. The one named Pico is nine thousand feet high. This mountain has the form of an immense sugar-loaf; and if our readers can imagine a fairly-proportioned sugar-loaf, nine thousand feet in height, and themselves situated above it, so as to be able to look down upon its apex, they will have an approximate idea of the appearance of Pico. There are many other mountains of a similar description scattered over the moon's surface; and these mountains not only stand apart from each other, but what is still more remarkable, the plains on which they stand are but slightly disturbed. How singular, then, the influence that shot the mountain up nine thousand feet, and yet scarcely disturbed the plain in the immediate neighborhood. The second class or lunar elevations consists of mountain ranges. Now, this is the principal feature of the mountains on earth. This phenomenon is also found in the moon, but there it is the exception; and only two principal ranges are found, and these appear to have been originally one range. One is called the Apennines. It is so well seen, that, just as the line of light is passing through the moon, you will think it is, generally speaking, a crack in its surface; but a telescope of ordinary power will at once manifest it to be a range of mountains. The lunar Apennines may be compared with the loftiest range of mountains upon earth. It is eighteen thousand feet high, and there is another range still higher, rising twenty five thousand feet above its base. In this feature, then the moon corresponds with the earth, but with this difference—what is the rule on the earth is the exception in the moon.—Literary Journal.
