On the 18th of February, 1849, Cardinal Antonelli, in a note to the powers, solicited, in the name of the sovereign pontiff, the armed intervention of France, Spain and Naples, and the moral support of the rest of Europe. Pius IX. was not, however, restored to his See. There was a disposition to impose terms upon him; and Pius was not inclined to submit to any such terms.
