THE HOOK-WORM DISEASE.

The elimination of the malarial disease known as the hook-worm disease, which is said to have spread until it infects two million people in the Southern States, mostly poor whites, is no less an economic question than one of hygiene.

It is now fully demonstrated that it is a real disease, destructive of life as well as all ambition and energy, proceeding from an intestinal parasite in the form of a minute worm or blood-sucker, which attaches itself, sometimes in great numbers, to the interior tissue of the intestines and draws upon the blood until all vigor and finally life itself is exhausted.

Assigning a fund of a million dollars to be employed in the course of five years, under the direction of a competent scientific and medical commission, for this purpose, is a beneficent act with which Mr. John D. Rockefeller is to be generously credited.

Waste of Children's Lives About 200,000 Die Annually From Preventable Death Causes.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 2.—American race waste—more serious than race suicide—is pointed out in Census Mortality Bulletin No. 104, in which it is estimated that annually in the United States from 188,000 to 200,000 babies under five years of age die from preventable causes.

In analyzing and comparing the totals obtained in the compilation of transcripts of death returns received for the year 1908 by the Census Bureau from the entire death-registration area of the United States, set forth in the bulletin, those for age periods show a somewhat increased per cent. of deaths of infants under one year for 1908, although the ratio for each of the individual years from one to four are identical for 1907 and 1908.

More than one-eighth of a million babies, under one year of age and fully 200,000 children, under five years of age, died among about one-half of the total population of the United States in the year mentioned. It is confidently probable that fully 200,000 more died in those cities and states not included in the Census Bureau death-registration area.

"It does not seem unreasonable," Dr. Wilbur states, "when we consider the fact that there is apparently no reason why infants, if properly born, and this means simply the prevention of ante-natal disease and the improvement of the health and conditions of life of their parents, should die at all in early infancy or childhood, except from the comparatively small proportion of accidents that are strictly unavoidable."

The bulletin continues with a statement that the general death rate of a country is largely dependent upon its infant mortality, because the death rates of infants and young children are high and they affect a relatively numerous element of the population.
