Miss Maggie Walz Plans to Start School and Home for Friendless Girls and Women—Stock Company Proposed to Buy Superior Hotel for Purpose—Support From U. P. Women.

At a special meeting of the members of the Woman's Christian Temperance union, held yesterday afternoon at the home of Mrs. H. D. Bell, Miss Maggie Walz, of Calumet, outlined her plan for purchasing the Hotel Superior and transforming it into a woman's school, home and sanitarium, says the Marquette Mining Journal.

Miss Walz desires as large an attendance as possible at the December meeting, at which the public will be given opportunity to suggest the particular manner in which it is best to utilize the hotel and the most effective scheme for the administration of the project.
