### COUNCIL PASSES RESOLUTION PRAISING ULSETH'S SERVICES

Last night's council meeting in Red Jacket, was marked by the passing of a unanimous resolution, thanking Edward Ulseth, the retiring trustee, for his splendid work on the board during the past six years.

Following the adoption of the resolution, which was moved by Councilman John Miller, and duly seconded, Mr. Ulseth stated how deeply he felt his severance from the village board, and that pressure of business only was responsible for his decision. He remarked that he had always worked in harmony with the president and his brother colleagues on the council, and that everything he had advocated while in office had been for the general welfare of the village. He added, that although he was retiring from active work on the board as one of its members, he should always have the interests of the village at heart, and that his services were always at the disposal of the council.

The resolution follows: "Whereas, Trustee Edward Ulseth has served as a member of the council of the village of Red Jacket for the past six years, and, whereas, Mr. Ulseth's services in that capacity have been characterized by signal ability and have been of inestimable value to the officers and inhabitants of the village, and, whereas, during his term of office he has always cheerfully devoted his time, energy and ability to the office, looking only to the best interests and welfare of the village and its residents.

"Therefore, be it resolved, that the president and trustees of the village of Red Jacket extend to Mr. Ulseth their sincerest appreciation and thanks for the honest, faithful, and impartial services he has rendered the said village.

"Be it further resolved that this resolution be spread at large, upon the minutes of this meeting."

Previous to passing the resolution, the board ratified Monday's annual election. Frank M. Kinsman is the only new member, he taking the place of Edward Ulseth. The newly-elected councilman will sit for the first time at the April meeting.
