

# NEWS of the FRATERNAL SOCIETIES

The third rank will be conferred at the regular meeting of Charity Lodge, No. 131, Knights of Pythias tomorrow evening and it is expected there will be a large attendance, this being the first time the degree has been conferred this fall. Capt. A. E. Rosewarren is organizing a strong team for the coming season and it is expected it will be able to make a very favorable impression in the coming contests.

Plans are being considered for the organization of a series of dual meets between the third rank degree teams of Calumet, LaPorte, Hancock, Houghton and Chassell lodges for the coming winter and as the teams of all of the other lodges have been well organized, it is expected these contests will go a long way towards preparing the teams for the contests in connection with next year's upper peninsula reunion and bringing about better work.

Last year each lodge in the county entertained all of the other lodges at a big social session.

Special programs were rendered and the gatherings were among the most interesting of the fraternal year. A similar plan is being considered for this year and at each of the dual meets there probably will be a social session.

All of the upper country lodges are also arranging for attendance contests to be conducted during the fall and winter months. These should result in increased membership and interest. At the end of each contest the members of the losing side will banquet the members of the winning side.

One of the big features in store for the members of Charity lodge is the banquet to be tendered by the Gophers, losers in last year's membership contest to the Wolverines. For various reasons this was postponed last spring until after the summer adjournment was taken.

There will be three big district meetings or field days for the Michigan Pythians this month. The first of these will be held in Grand Rapids, Nov. 11, the second at Saginaw, Nov. 12 and the third at Detroit, Nov. 13. It is probable that the grand officers will designate a field day for the upper peninsula lodges to be held during the winter. The copper country branches likely will make a strong bid for such a gathering.

The members of Laurium Lodge, Knights of Pythias are arranging for a series of novel entertainments to be given during the next few months. The committee in charge of the arrangements for these events probably will make public definite plans in the near future.

**U. P. Odd Fellows' League.**  
A meeting will be held at Marquette Nov. 18 for the purpose of considering a project to organize an upper peninsula league of Odd Fellows.

Thomas Conlin of Crystal Falls, grand high priest of the grand encampment of Michigan, explains that the matter of an upper peninsula league was broached at the recent grand encampment meeting in Lower Michigan and that the upper peninsula delegates named the following committee:

Thomas Conlin, Crystal Falls, chairman; John Neville, Gladstone; W. J. Hoffenbacher, Hancock; George Blair, Sault Ste. Marie; N. M. McLean, Marquette.

Mr. Hoffenbacher brings the matter before Foster encampment at Hancock tonight and believes he will be instructed to work for the proposed league. He personally favors it as a plan that will bring the upper peninsula Odd Fellows into closer touch.

In the event of the organization of the league the copper country will undoubtedly have a big voice in its affairs as the copper country is one of the strongest Odd Fellows districts of the state of Michigan.

In the Odd Fellows parent organization, it has two lodges at Calumet and one each at Allouez, Lake Linden, Hancock, Houghton, South Range, Sidsaw, Greenland, Rockland, Ontonagon, Baraga and L'Anse. There are two encampments in the copper country, Foster of Hancock and Calumet of Calumet. The Patriarchs Militant, the military branch of the order, has two cantons in the copper country, Houghton, Canton Superior, and Calumet, Canton Copper City.

The woman's branch of the order, the Rebekah assembly, has lodges at Calumet (two), Lake Linden, Houghton, Hancock and South Range.

Mr. Hoffenbacher believes that if an upper peninsula league of Odd Fellows is organized a similar organization of Rebekahs will be inevitable. Mrs. Thomas Conlin of Crystal Falls is head of the Rebekah assembly of Michigan and undoubtedly will be as interested in forming a league of the auxiliary as her husband is for the men's branches.

Comedie Francaise Has Volumes Read at St. Helena.

Paris, Nov. 6.—Comedie Francaise has just acquired an interesting treasure—the copy of Moliere, in eight volumes, which Napoleon had with him at St. Helena. It was part of a library of about 400 volumes which the emperor's will bequeathed to his son. The Duc de Reichstadt being dead, however, the books were distributed among other relatives.

The Moliere fell to Joseph's share, and it is now presented to the national theater by Joseph's great-grandson, Count Primoli, to whom it was given by his uncle, Cardinal Bonaparte. It is a fitting souvenir of the sovereign, who said: "Opera is the vanity of the French; comedy is their glory."
