The Laurium baseball team defeated the Portage Lakes at the Hancock driving park yesterday afternoon in a fast and exciting game by the score of 5 to 4. The game was won by the visitors in the ninth inning, Portage Lake holding the lead up to that period. Pitcher Dunnigan for the visitors won his own game in the last frame by a line drive over second. Two errors by Kaiser and a wild throw by Stegman to Gilbert at the plate in an attempt to catch a runner combined to aid in the defeat of the locals. The game was one of the best exhibitions of the national played in Hancock for some time.

Dunnigan on the mound for the visitors, was invincible, and the local players seemed unable to connect readily with his offerings, although at times they hit the ball hard. Kaiser played well for the locals until the ninth inning, which seemed disastrous for all players on the Portage team. Frimodig worked hard at short. His hitting was not up to standard, however.

Story of the Game. The locals started the scoring in the initial inning, after the Laurium batters had been put out in order. Royce was walked by Dunnigan. Anderson was hit by a pitched ball. Kaiser drove to left field for two bases, assisting Royce and advancing Anderson to third. Anderson was caught napping and was put out.
