AN EYE ON LOUISIANA.

The Post Says the Republicans of That
State Have Chosen Wisely.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—The Republi-
cans are watching the course of events
in Louisiana with a good deal of inter-
est. They are not without hope that the
complicated condition there may put
their party in power in the state. It is
believed there will be an effort to induce
the two factions of the Republican party
to unite and that the Warmoth faction
may be induced to withdraw from the
fight upon some agreement of a division
of spoils in the case of success. The ac-
ceptance or rejection of this proposition
it is believed would depend upon the
size of the peace offering made the War-
moth faction. Should a combination be
affected, it is believed large sums of
money will be forwarded from the north
for the purpose of making a desperate
effort to capture the state in hope that
it might be held in line in the next
presidential campaign. The Wash-
ington Post, which has pulled
into line for the administration,
begins a significant editorial on the
subject this morning and says: "The Re-
publicans in Louisiana have chosen a
wise and manly part and entered the
local campaign to make a straight party
contest."


Farmers Fight a Duel.

DALLAS, Jan. 22.—A sanguinary bat-
tle between two farmers residing in the
vicinity of Rowlette, this county, took
place Wednesday evening, and the
meagre particulars reached this city
today. The parties to the tragedy are
Benjamin Page and Michael Coyle, two
well known farmers, married men with
families. They got into a dispute over
the settlement of an account and hot
words were exchanged. Both men were
dead game and they determined then
and there to wipe out the score with
blood. Coyle raised his shotgun and
Page leveled his pistol. Both fired
at the same instant. Page fell dead in
his tracks, shot through the heart, and
Coyle reeled over mortally wounded
with a bullet hole in his stomach.
Coyle will die. The tragedy created
great excitement in the Rowlette neigh-
borhood.

The Color Line Drawn.

PADUCAH, Ky., Jan. 22.—A number of
white boys were skating on a pond near
here when a colored boy attempted to
join the party. A row ensued when it
was proposed to hang the negro. He
was overpowered and several boys tied
their skate straps together and then tied
one end to the negro's neck. The straps
were thrown over a limb and the boys
pulled him up. He was nearly dead
when the straps parted. The boys were
about to repeat the hanging when some
men came along and stopped them and
turned the negro loose. The boys had
dug a grave for their victim and said
they fully intended to put him in it.
Friday last there was a hanging here
and this suggested to the boys a good
way to get rid of an intruder. The inci-
dent leaked out today and there is con-
siderable excitement over the matter
both among the blacks and whites.
