WACO FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Location of Fire Alarm Boxes.

Table listing fire alarm boxes with locations: 4 Fifth Ward Fire Station strikes IIII, 5 Corner 9th and Austin IIIII, 6 4th IIIII, 7 Central Fire Station IIIII, 8 West End Fire Station IIIII, 13 Corner 14th and Washington I-IIII, 14 5th and Malborough I-IIII, 15 8th and Columbus I-IIII, 16 8th and Jackson I-IIII, 17 4th and Webster I-IIII, 23 8th and Cleveland I-IIII, 25 5th and Spaight I-IIII, 27 6th and Washington I-IIII, 35 Royal Hotel 5th and Franklin III-IIII, 36 Woolen Mills 13th and Mary III-IIII, 37 Corner 14th and Jefferson III-IIII.

All boxes numbered above 8 strikes thus: Box 13 strikes I and stops, then strikes IIII making Box 13, then repeats four times. Box 25 strikes II and stops, then strikes IIII making Box 25 at 4.30 on.

DIRECTIONS FOR GIVING ALARM. Keys will be found in residences on each corner where boxes are located. Open Fire Alarm Boxes and pull Hook down and let go. Leave key in box.

Turn alarm in only for fires. \$10.00 fine for false alarm.

Slow tapping of bells signify company calls.

Second Friday in each month each box is tapped twice, testing boxes and circuit line.

When alarm of the Fire Department has the right of way on all streets. All vehicles must drive near the sidewalk and keep away from the fire. \$5.00 fine for running over horse.

Report of any careless driving going to or from Boxes by the Fire Department will be thankfully received by the Chief, as fast and careless driving is strictly forbidden.

AN ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance Authorizing and Empowering the Missouri, Kansas & Texas Railway Company to Construct a Switch or Spur on Jackson Street, Acor ss Tenth Street. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Waco:

Sec. 1. That the Missouri Kansas & Texas Railway Company, be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and operate a switch or spur connecting with its main track from near the eastern edge of Tenth street to the eastern edge of Eleventh street, at a point at or near the Western edge of Tenth street; thence along Jackson street and the property line to the western edge of the alley between Ninth and Tenth streets.

Sec. 2. Before said Railway Company shall be authorized to construct said spur or switch it shall apply to the city engineer of Waco and obtain from him the proper grade of said street, and said track shall be constructed under the direction and supervision of the city engineer, and shall conform to the grade given by said engineer; and before said railway company shall be permitted to use said spur or switch, it shall place on each side of the rails of said track, where the same crosses or is laid in said Jackson and Tenth streets a piece of timber two or more inches thick and six or more inches in width, and shall fill in between the two rails and between the main track and the spur or switch so constructed, with stone and gravel, as directed by the city engineer, and grade Tenth street where said switch or spur crosses it, so as to make the surface of the street level with the top of the rails of said roads.

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of said railway company to at all times keep said spur or switch and the main track in good repair and well ballasted with stone and gravel, and it shall at no time allow any cars, engines or other obstructions to occupy or remain on that portion of said spur or switch which lies between the main line of said track and the outside edge of the sidewalk, along said Jackson street.

Sec. 4. If at any time said railway company shall fail or refuse to keep said track and the street between the spur or switch and the main track in good order, or shall fail or refuse to repair the same when requested to do so by the city marshal, or mayor, or street commissioners of said city, then the city council may by a resolution adopted and spread upon the minutes of said city, revoke the franchise and repeal this ordinance and all rights, privileges and benefits granted said railway company herein shall be withdrawn.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
