

Board of Trade.
Last Wednesday, July 6th, was a day of great importance to San Saba. The Board of Trade, which has been slowly organizing met at the Court house for the purpose of affecting a permanent organization. Several names were added to the list of members. The membership now reaches 40 or more. Several exciting speeches were made. All present took great interest in the meeting. After some warm discussions, a resolution was offered that the meeting proceed to the election of a Board of Directors. The constitution provided for seven directors. Amid great excitement and enthusiasm, the ballot was cast and the votes counted, resulting in the election of Jno. Seiders, N. D. Lidstone, J. H. Martin, W. B. Leverett, G. H. Hagan, Geo. Harris and E. L. Rector. Immediately after this the meeting adjourned and the Board of Directors proceeded to carry out the provisions of the constitution which required of the Board of Directors to elect from among themselves a chairman of the Board of Trade. Mr. J. H. Martin was elected to that position. Mr. W. B. Leverett was elected Vice-president, Mr. Jno. Seiders, secretary; Mr. N. D. Lidstone, Treasurer. The next business in order was providing for the various committees. It is agreed that one of the Directors should serve on each committee and also to select from among the members two gentlemen to serve with him on his committee, and that the names so selected be reported at the next meeting of Directors which was set for Monday July 13th.
