#### Will Seal Voting Box.

After the box has been locked, the key will be turned over to the local Pastors' Association for safe keeping until the close of the race next Saturday night at 8 o'clock, at which time the key will be delivered to a committee of reliable and impartial business men who will break the seals, unlock the voting box, count all votes and determine the six winners of the premiums valued at \$2,700.00 to be given by the Caller-Herald.

#### LATE MARKET REPORT.


