BRUSSELS FALLS TO GERMANS

THE TRUE FACTS CONCERNING CITY TAXATION AND DEBTS ARE FURNISHED

After announcing the fall of Brussels, an official announcement says the French troops have met with brilliant successes in Alsace-Lorraine, particularly between Metz and Aisne. "The Germans, retreating on the Rhine, left us many prisoners and 24 guns. In Lorraine, the French were less fortunate," says the announcement. "There they were forced by a strong counter-attack to fall back in a body, which is now solidly established on the Meuse, and along the canal from the Meuse to the Rhine."

INDEPENDENCE FOR FILIPINOS SOON TO BE MATERIALIZED

HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORTS JONES BILL FAVORABLY FOR HOME RULE.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20.—The House committee on Philippine affairs today favorably reported the Jones bill which declares the United States will grant the Philippines independence later in the year. The bill provides for a transition period of five years, during which the United States will maintain a protectorate over the islands. The bill also provides for the establishment of a Philippine assembly and for the appointment of a Philippine governor. The bill is expected to pass the House in the near future.

JAPAN SAYS GERMANY HAD STRENGTHENED FORTS

WASHINGTON HEARS FULL TEXT OF JAPAN'S DEMANDS TO OTHER NATION.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20.—The full text of Japan's demands to Germany was made known here tonight. The demands are for the evacuation of German troops from the Korean peninsula and for the withdrawal of German troops from the Chinese coast. Japan also demands that Germany should respect the rights of the Chinese people and should not interfere with the Chinese government. The demands are considered to be very serious and are expected to lead to further negotiations between the two nations.

RUSSIAN TROOPS BEING WHIPPED INTO SHAPE TO COMBAT AUSTRIANS GAIN

(By Associated Press.) After sixteen days of fighting, it seems now that they are on German troops on French soil. The Germans have occupied Brussels, but the latest reports say the French have captured Metz and Aisne. The Germans are making no headway in Alsace. There is no news of naval engagements in the North Sea or the Mediterranean. Fighting on Eastern Front.
