LONDON, Aug. 25 (Tuesday).—A Copenhagen dispatch says that telegrams to that city state Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria is very ill, and is expected to die within a few hours.

(By Associated Press) PARIS, Aug. 24.—The French and English, their plan of attack having failed, owing to unforeseen difficulties, have retired on their covered positions. This was announced from the French war office at 11:30 p. m. tonight. The announcement continues: "Our troops are intact, but for a while they will remain on the defensive. Then, when the time comes, they will resume the offensive. Our losses are heavy, and so are the Germans. We are unable to estimate either now."

"The Germans suffered heavily they were caused to abandon their counter-attacks, and establish themselves in fresh position in Lorraine. West of the Meuse, the English army on our left was attacked by Germans but behaved admirably, holding its ground with traditional steadfastness."
