They killed Two Men in the Territory and so far the Death Penalty.

WICHITA, Kan., Nov. 21.—Jas and Joe Tabler, colored, were executed this morning in the county jail in the presence of but few people by the federal authorities.

The crime for which they were executed was the killing of Cassand Goody Knave near the Sac and Fox agency, August 18, 1886.
