SOME INTERESTING HISTORY.
S. A. Castles, member of the State Historical Association, of Austin, Texas, is now in Robertson and Brazos counties collecting information for publication in the "Quarterly Journal of History of Texas." Mr. Castles submits the following documents that he has procured from D. W. Love of Wheelock, Texas, (a son of Capt. G. H. Love) as a partial record of company C, 18th Texas Cavalry.

This company was organized in August 1863, on Cedar Creek in Brazos county, with men principally from Brazos, Robertson and Leon counties. The officers were: Captain G. H. Love; 1st Lieutenant J. C. Chopen; 2nd Lieutenant John Durst; 3rd Lieutenant, W. W. Hurley; 1st Sergeant, J. C. Calvert; 2nd Sergeant, Castles; Corporal, E. S. Parrish. The muster roll herewith published contains only the names of the members of the company who resided in Brazos county. The part of the muster roll containing the names of the men who joined this company from Leon and Robertson counties cannot be found. Muster Roll of Captain G. H. I herewith submit the following orders to show that the regiment that Capt. Love's company was in belonged to the Trans-Mississippi Department. Headquarters Trans-Mississippi Department. Special orders, No. 75. Shreveport, La., March 29, 1865. VI. In accordance with Par. 1, General Order No. 99, Series of 1864, Department Headquarters, Sergeant David McIntosh, Co. I, Twenty-First Texas Cavalry, is transferred to Love's Company of Brazos County, Texas.

By command of General E. Kirby Smith.
P. B. Seeds Major and Assistant Adjutant General.
Commander of Love's company, Brazos county, Texas, through Bureau of Conscription, A. B. S.
Special Orders No. 75, Par. VI. Headquarters 1st Reg. Anderson, Texas, May 1st, 1865. Capt. Love will take this man on his muster roll as per orders.
Signed, Jas. W. Barnes, Col. Commanding.

Capt. Love's company left their camp, Camp Killough, about the 20th of Aug., 1865; went to Houston, remained there only a few days when the regiment was ordered to Louisiana, where it remained until the fall or winter of 1864, when it was ordered back into Texas. The writer joined this regiment, Capt. Love's company near Houston, Texas, Jan. 1st, 1865, the day he was twelve years and eleven days old. He claims the honor of being the youngest soldier who bore arms in the civil war. He remained with the regiment until it was disbanded in May 1865.

Forty-four years have passed away in history. Few of the "old boys" now remain to meet at our annual reunions to cherish the traditions of the old South, to commemorate the heroic deeds of the grandest army that ever trod the earth or died for homes or state's rights.

This article is written in the hope that it may perchance meet the eye of some of our "Old Boys" or be the means of assisting them in getting the pension that they so rightfully deserve.

If there are more than eight of Capt. Love's company now living I do not know it. Their names and post office addresses are: Albert Cobb, Hoarne, Texas; Wm. Yardley, Franklin, Texas; J. M. Seale, Centerville, Texas; M. L. Palmer, Jewett, Texas; J. C. Lamon, Oakwood, Texas; S. A. Castles, Duffalo, Texas; John Wilson, Abilene, Texas.

I cannot close this article without offering my humble tribute to our beloved old Captain, G. H. Love, whom I consider one of the best men I have ever been my happy privilege to meet. Monuments of marble and bronze may decay but Capt. G. H. Love's good deeds are enshrined in the hearts of

his countrymen and will be honored and revered as long as valor and patriotism burn on the altar of the heart of a Texan.

The above official statements are correct, but the historical part is gathered from the defective memories of the few survivors of Love's company.
