## SECRETARY BRYAN DENIES INTERVENTION

Says Positively His Application For Funds For Destitute Americans In Mexico Had No Intervention Significance—Would Bring Out All In Real Danger.

[By Associated Press.]  
Washington, Aug. 2.—Secretary of State Bryan today vigorously asserted there was no ground whatever for the printed predictions that his request yesterday for one hundred thousand dollars appropriation to get destitute Americans out of Mexico had any connection with possible intervention. Some officials in fact, hold that Secretary Bryan's request is a forerunner of non-intervention. It is accepted as one step in the administration's plans for dealing with Mexico.

It is understood the president believes the United States' chief aim should be the protection of the lives and property of Americans in Mexico. The hundred thousand dollars will go far toward bringing out all destitute Americans who think their lives are imperiled.

**Statement to Country Bankers.**

**Federal Aid to Move Crops.**

Washington, Aug. 2.—The fifty million dollars which the government intends to loan to the Southern and Western banks will be placed in the large cities in the agricultural regions with the provision that these banks distribute it to the country banks at reasonable rates. New Orleans, Atlanta, Chicago, and St. Louis are to receive a substantial portion of this money.

### EX-GOV. BRITO CAUGHT IN NEW ORLEANS

Brito Admits That He Killed Two Huerta Soldiers During Madero's Overthrow.

New Orleans, Aug. 2.—Emanuel Castillo Brito, former governor of the Campeche, Mexico, was arrested today by federal authorities charged with murder and robbery. The charges were made by the Mexican federal government. Brito admitted that he killed two Huerta soldiers during the Madero overthrow. He said they tried to arrest him and slapped him with their swords whereupon he shot them.
