WONDERS OF RADIUM IN CANCER CURE

PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS
AMAZED AT RESULTS OF
EXPERIMENTS.

Philadelphia, Dec. 16.—Physicians and surgeons here were amazed at addresses made today by Dr. Howard A. Kelly of Johns Hopkins Hospital and Dr. Robert Abbe of New York announcing that the word cure can be applied properly to radium in cancer treatment. Dr. Kelly showed the astounded physicians photographs showing patients before and after the cure. He told of one cure in forty-eight hours of cancerous growth on the face and head.

Both physicians were careful to explain that these cures were all so far in cases only of superficial cancer. That it is still unknown what radium will do for advanced or internal cases.

CARABAO OFFICERS NOT HOSTILE TO POLICY

Hastened to Assure the President
That Meaning of Satires
Were Misconstrued.

HOUSE PROGRESSIVES PASS RESOLUTIONS

View With Interest Deathbed Repentance of Republicans in Their Effort to Reunite.

The resolutions concluded: "We accept with profound gratitude President Wilson's endorsement of the progressive principles of direct primaries and pledge him our support."

RELIEF COMMITTEE HELD MEETING

The Governor's Representatives Were Present and Approved Everything That Had Been Done.

The General Relief Committee held a meeting this morning for the purpose of meeting with Capt. Bowman, private secretary to Governor Colquitt, and Capt. Wagner of the National Guard, who made an inspection of the Bryan flooded territory yesterday. They expressed their views very freely as being of the opinion that the condition was so bad that to exaggerate it would not be possible. They wired the Governor, recommending that the sanitary condition being of such magnitude that the Health Department take immediate action to dispose of the dead animals, and as immediate relief is needed, they suggested that a car of lime be sent here at once. They also recommend that 1,000 quilts or comforts be issued here at once. They expressed approval of everything that the local committee had done in the past and has planned for the future.
