QUICK METHOD TO OUST JUDGES

Tennessee Congressman Proposed a Constitutional Amendment for Quick Firing of Judges.

Washington, March 31.—Representative Hull of Tennessee, author of the income tax law, vigorously upheld his proposed amendment to the constitution providing for a more simple and expeditious method of removing judges

of inferior courts found to be unfit for office. The amendment, which now is before the House Judiciary Committee, would, according to Mr. Hull, do away with the present cumbersome impeachment procedure.

The amendment would empower Congress to abolish any inferior court and to remove a judge of any inferior court from office by resolution, if concurred in by two-thirds of both Houses, but such judge would have notice and opportunity to be heard either in person or by counsel. The necessity for a more simplified method of removing Federal judges is apparent, in the opinion of Mr. Hull.
