REVOLUTIONISTS LOSE IN CHINA

 London, Jan. 13.—Chinese government troops won a bloody victory over the revolutionists in a three-day battle beginning Jan. 6, according to British government advices from Hong Kong. They exhausted many of their officers and many men were killed and taken prisoners.

GREEK QUEEN, HIS SISTER HAS BEEN SUMMONED

German Kaiser Expected to Die and His Sister, the Queen of Greece, Has Been Summoned. Teutonic Drive Begun Against Salonika, an Important Greek Seaport, Held by a Large Allied Force Strongly Entrenched.—A Teutonic Attack Has Been Expected Since the Overthrow of Serbia Was Completed—Austrians Continue to Advance in Montenegro and the Evacuation of the Montenegrin Capital Is Imminent—English Miners Against Conscription—France Will Buy Ships—Allies' Attacks Repulsed.

ATTACK ON SALONIKI.

(By Associated Press.)
 London, Jan. 13.—The Teutons' long expected drive at Saloniki, the Greek port in the hands of the allies, has begun on a large scale, according to advices today from Rome.
 The bombardment of the British first line defenses has been in progress for two days.
 French engineers have blown up the big railroad bridge over the Struma River at Demir.
 The Montenegrin government is preparing to evacuate the capital at

Cettinje, according to a Scutara dispatch, because of Austrian success and advances toward the metropolis. The Austrians continue to advance from Cattaro toward Antivar.

Miners Against Conscription.

 London, Jan. 12.—The Miners' Federation of Great Britain today voted to oppose the government military compulsion bill. What step the federation is to take in case the bill passes will be considered later.

France to Buy Ships.

 Paris, France, Jan. 12.—The ship-paign needs of French steamer companies has inspired a move for a government subsidy of 100,000,000 francs. This will be used to relieve the shortage by buying ships from allied or neutral nations.

Allies Attacks Repulsed.

London, Jan. 13.—A strong British attack near Armentieres and two French onslaughts were repulsed by the Germans in the Champagne district, says Berlin.

The Huronian Torpedoed.

New York, Jan. 13.—The new Leyland liner Huronian was torpedoed near the spot where the Lusitania went down, according to advices at the office here today. The attack was made Dec. 29 and the vessel is reported to have been towed to a British port crippled. The Huronian sailed Dec. 12 from Galveston.

MEXICAN AMBASSADOR IS SORRY

 Washington, Jan. 13.—The Mexican ambassador today assured Secretary Lansing that a quick move would be made against the Villistas in Chihuahua. He expressed regret over the massacre of the eighteen Americans.

City National and First State Elect Directors and Officers.



EL PASO INSULTS PRESIDENT WILSON

Petitions Theodore Roosevelt to Use Influence for a Change in the Administration's Policy.

 El Paso, Tex., Jan. 13.—The bodies of eighteen Americans killed on Monday by Mexican bandits near Santa Ysabel, Chihuahua, arrived here early today and will be sent to relatives in various parts of the country.

A report current here today that ten American men and two English women had been killed by Villa troops near Madera was not confirmed. A petition is being circulated asking Theodore Roosevelt to use his influence to induce the administration and congress to change the policy toward Mexico to a more vigorous treatment of such outrages. The petition will be sent to Roosevelt later.

MORE EARTHQUAKE SHOCKS WERE FELT
