INSPECTION TRIP BY CONGRESSMEN

Party to Visit Bryan Friday, May 26. Improvements Sure to Result From Trip.

The officers of the Brazos River and Valley Improvement Association, which was in session in Houston Saturday, perfected arrangements for the entertainment of the congressional committee which is to visit this section of the state next week. The meeting was presided over by President W. W. Seley of Waco, and among those present were Judge J. W. Munson of Angleton, William Doherty and Adolph Boldt of Houston, O. A. Zumbalt of Columbus, J. R. Astin of Bryan and railroad officials at Houston.

The party from Washington will arrive in Houston on the night of the 22nd and will start on their trip the next morning, which will be Tuesday, May 23. They will reach Bryan, according to schedule, at 3:10 p. m. Friday, May 26, and will remain in the city for two hours, leaving at 5 o'clock for Hearne.

The purpose of the tour of inspection by the congressional committee is to insure congressional action so as to make thousands of acres of land in the Brazos, Colorado and Trinity valleys safe from further damage from floods. Under the direction of the Brazos River and Valley Improvement Association all of the railroads operating in this territory and all of the towns to be visited are preparing figures showing the damage done by floods in the past, to present to the congressional committee for their consideration.

It was a conceded fact at the meeting in Houston that some results were sure to follow the visit of the congressional committee. "This movement," said the president, Mr. Seley of Waco, "is more in the interest of Houston and her trade territory than any other city in Texas. However, when the movement gets started it is sure to be followed up in other districts."

The reception committee which has been selected to meet the party from Washington at Houston next Tuesday and accompany them on the trip includes the names of Senator J. R. Astin and James O. Chance of this city.
