NEW SECTION TO BE OPENED SOON

Work Being Done by I. & G. N. and City of Bryan to Open Practically New Business Street

A large crew of workmen is now busily engaged in putting in a segment block sewer on the lower part of Bryan Street at Austin Street, where Bryan Street has always had a terminus and the street crossing Bryan Street has gone under the I. & G. N. tracks. With this improvement the water will, with this block sewer, be carried on the north side of the track on a level with the track, then down Austin Street to Wheelock Street and there turned loose. When the system of drainage, which is the best known of this character, is completed, the fill will be made under the tracks on Bryan Street and made level all the way down and traffic crossing at this point will go over the tracks instead of under them as heretofore. The fill will be made of earth with a good coat of gravel.

This improvement is going to do what has been needed to be done for a long time. It is going to open up another good business street for the City of Bryan. It will in this way give another section upon which to erect business houses, where the increasing population can carry on their trading. Unless we miss our guess, it will only be a matter of time until you will see some of the best store buildings of Bryan right in this section of the city. You will see Bryan Street paved from the I. & G. N. station to the north end of the oil mill spur track, and trade will be carried on from one end of Bryan Street to the other just the same as it is for gasoline.

WONDERS OF COAL TAR EMPHASIZED BY WAR

"Although modern high explosives require vast quantities of nitric acid, sulphuric acid, and alcohol, the basic ingredient of most is a derivative of coal tar, which in turn is a by-product of coke burning. Here is the industry, with all its branches and ramifications, which perhaps more than any other in this country has been expanded by the war. In coal tar we have the imprisoned sunshine of millions of years, and when that prehistoric brilliance is released by one set of stage of processes we have modern dyestuffs. Still other processes and we have naphthalene (camphor balls), and many modern drugs, such as aspirin; while the photographic, phonographic, and many other industries depend more or less completely upon it. Finally benzol, which is the first stage in the process and from which all these other products come, is the most immediately available substitute to the other just the same as it is for gasoline."

RAT ROW SEWER NOW BEING LAID

Property Owners in This Section of the City Will Be Required to Connect Up at Once.

For some time our energetic and enthusiastic city engineer, A. S. Adams, in connection with the many other branches of civic improvement that he has been pushing, has been working on a sewer line for the lower part of Main Street, known as Rat Row, which is a section of the business district of Bryan that has never had a city sewer service.

A force of men is now at work on this line and same is being laid on Bryan Street from Caldwell Street to Calhoun Street, which will take in Rat Row, the Allen Smith block and the Palermo block. This is a very much needed improvement and Mr. Adams and the members of the City Council should be given a unanimous vote of thanks for this step. All property owners in this section of the city will be required to connect up with the sewer immediately after it is finished.

All sewer manholes in this section of the city are being raised about ten feet so as to put them on a line with the I. & G. N. track on Bryan Street, which is now being put up to the street level as a result of an effort made by Engineer Adams and Alderman Vick in a trip to Houston to visit the officials of that road some few weeks ago. This is a long step in the way of civic improvement and will remove an old eye-sore from view which has been in the City of Bryan for many years. Let the good work proceed.


