**HEAD OF CHINESE EMPIRE IS DEAD**

(By Associated Press)  
Shanghai, June 6.—President Yuan Shi Kai, of the Chinese Republic, died yesterday.  
Yuan Shi Kai was reported seriously ill on May 28. Dispatches from Peking that he had been poisoned, but this was denied by the Chinese ambassador at Washington, who insisted that the president was not even ill. He died while the storm of the revolution against his reign was gathering in increasing strength.  
Yuan Hung, vice president, succeeds Yuan Shi Kai. It is said Hung is favorable to the revolutionists.
