ORDER OF ELECTION.

At a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Bryan, held on the 8th day of September, A. D. 1916, Alderman Tyler Haaswell offered the following resolution ordering an election for the improvement of the sewer system of the City of Bryan, and which was duly seconded by Alderman J. S. Doane, and being put to a vote of the City Council, J. S. Doane, B. U. Sims, Tyler Haaswell, John C. Vick and W. S. Wilson, Jr., here voting for said order, and no votes being cast against same, and which resolution or order was duly carried, is as follows:

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Bryan deems it advisable to issue bonds of said city for the purpose hereinafter mentioned:

Therefore, it is hereby ordered by the City Council of said City of Bryan that an election be held on the first Tuesday in November, A. D. 1916, same being the 7th day of November, A. D. 1916, at which election the following proposition is to be submitted:

Shall the City Council of the City of Bryan be authorized to issue bonds of said City in the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00), payable in forty (40) years after date with the option of redeeming same at any time after twenty (20) years from date, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent) per annum, interest payable semi-annually, and to levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund to redeem them at maturity, for the purpose of improving the sewer system of said City?

Said election shall be held at the City Hall of the City of Bryan, Brazos County, Texas, and the following persons are hereby appointed managers of said election:

C. E. Jones, Presiding Judge; Mat Vitopil, Assistant Judge; Wilson Bradley and Elmer Dodson, Clerks.

Said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter 149, Acts of the 26th Legislature, Laws of 1899, and under such other election laws of the State of Texas that are in force governing the same, and only qualified voters who are property tax payers of said city shall be allowed to vote, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue bonds shall have printed on their ballots the words: "For the Issuance of Sewer Improvement Bonds;" and those opposing shall have printed on their ballots the words: "Against the Issuance of Sewer Improvement Bonds." Such election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating General Elections.

A copy of this order, signed by the Mayor of the City of Bryan, shall serve as a proper notice of said election, and the Mayor is directed to cause Notice of the Election to be posted up at the place designated for holding said election, and at three public places in the City of Bryan, and by publication of said notice for at least thirty (30) days prior to said date of election.

CHURCH REMODELING IS POSTPONED

Building Committee of M. E. Church Decides to Defer Work Until the First of January.

At a meeting held this week of the building committee, appointed by the last quarterly conference of the Methodist church, and which has in hand the remodeling of the class room of the Wesley Bible class and the primary department, it was decided to postpone the work of same until the first of January. This action was taken owing to the fact that the busy fall season is upon us and the committee could not spare the time to devote to this matter that it should have when the work is started.

The plan outlined by the committee is to spend about \$6,000 in this remodeling. An addition to the southeast corner of the church is anticipated which will enlarge the Bible class room located on the second floor and the primary department, which is on the first floor directly under the Bible class room. To do this work properly and to care for these two fast growing departments it will be necessary to tear out the rear wall of the building and rebuild same back possibly 20 feet. It is only estimated the above amount will take care of the expense, as no actual figures have been made and the amount required might be much larger.

At this meeting Mr. Ed Hall was selected as chairman and Mr. James W. James was selected as secretary, and plans were outlined whereby a systematic campaign for funds will be inaugurated right after the first of January.
