Saturday's Victory Over Haskell Gives New Inspiration to Team and Student Body.

AMERICANS AND MEXICANS CLASH

Report to Funston Said Mexicans on This Side, Signaling Across, Were Arrested--Battle Followed.

San Antonio, Tex., Oct. 31.--The thirty Mexicans, who opened fire on an American detachment in the Big Bend district October 19, precipitating a fight that lasted for 45 minutes, were under the command of Chico Cano. This information was contained in a written report of the affair received Monday by General Funston from Major John D. Long, commanding the squadron of Texas cavalry on duty in the section.

Cano holds rank as captain in the Carranza garrison at Ojinaga. He has been identified with border disturbances for the last two or three years. Major Long's report threw the first light on the composition of the Mexican band.

According to the report the American detachment discovered two of the Mexicans on this side of the Rio Grande signaling to their companions to cross. The men were captured and are still being held for action by the civil authorities. After they had been taken, Cano's men opened fire.

The report indicated that soldiers in Cano's command had been drinking.

RECOGNIZED AS MOST FAMOUS FUNMAKERS, WILL ENTERTAIN VISITORS AT WOMAN'S FAIR.

ENTRY OF HIGH COCKALORUM

Chickens in Every Form That Can Be Served Will Be Seen in the Red Rooster Arrival Parade at Houston on Monday, November 6.

Houston, Tex.--Beginning with the arrival of High Cockalorum IV, whose entry, attended by ceremonies such as have been developed only by the Red Roosters, Houston's famous fun-makers, will be made into the city on the night of Monday, November 6. The Red Roosters will hold regal sway in Houston during the Texas Woman's Fair through the following Sunday. Burlesque parades, covering a wide range of subjects, will be given, the climax being attained at the Red Rooster street ball on the evening of Saturday, November 12, when High Cockalorum IV will be spurred amid a burst of splendor and blaze of electrical lightning on Main street.

The Red Roosters are recognized as probably the most original funmakers in the South. Fun and entertainment for Houston and Houston's visitors form the sole aim of the organization, and this year will see a series of parades such as have never before been seen in Texas.

All Kinds of Chickens in Arrival Procession.

Chickens in every form that it can be served will be seen in the Red Rooster arrival parade, which will start from the Red Rooster Barnyard on the Franklin avenue bridge Monday evening, November 6. The procession will be led by a Zouave band, which will be followed by High Cockalorum IV's float. On this float, in the costume which has been worn by all the High Cockalorums since the Red Rooster Inner Circle spurred its first leader four years ago, will be seen the new leader. From the tip of his toes to his shoulders he will be a Red Rooster. From his shoulders up he will be a man, and the man he will represent will, on the evening of November 6, be more in the public eye of America than any other man in the United States.

Coming after the High Cockalorum's float will be the chickens. They will all be on automobile trucks suitably decorated. There will be stewed chicken, chicken on toast, "chicken a la mode," broilers, old hens and young roosters. What "stewed chicken" will be can be guessed and advance notices on the parade from the committee chairman in charge of it are to the effect that there will be at least two chickens stewed for the benefit of the crowds along the street. What "chicken a la mode" will be can best be gathered from the old story of the cock who, when she served the tomatoes with their skins on, was ordered by the mistress to "serve 'em a la mode."

"Faith and what might that mode be?" queried Bridget. "According to the fashion--without covering," answered the mistress. Bridget looked around the table in dismay at the guests. "Sure and ye mane wid no kivering at all!"

"Certainly," replied the mistress. A few minutes later Bridget brought in the same tomatoes with the skins on them just as before. But it was at Bridget that mistress and guests gave a gasp of astonishment. All the "covering" she had on was a bath towel.

"Bedad, and if yez tells me to take off the towel yez can git anither cook," Bridget asserted, truculently.

There will be fourteen trucks of "chickens," not including automobile after automobile load of the various breeds of fowls. There will be Rhode Island Reds, Plymouth Rocks, black and white Minorcas, common scrubs and many others.

All the big cocks of South Texas will be on floats. In the language of the Red Roosters, the big cocks will be the prominent men of the State, among whom will be the mayors of a number of cities near Houston. Will Catch Villa on Second Night Parade.

Francisco Villa, erstwhile leader of revolutionists in Mexico, is going to meet his fate on the night of the second parade, Wednesday, November 8. The United States patrol that will catch him already is made up and it has been practicing ensnaring the wily Mexican since the Barnyard opened two weeks ago. This, however, will be but one feature of the parade which will be known as the "Armies of All Nations."

There will be an English army, German army, French army, Hebrew army, Chinese army, a negro army, an American army and a dozen other armies. And the funny part about it is that the general of the German army is a Frenchman, and a German is general of the English army!

Some of the armies will be clad in the uniform of the country they represent, but some will be burlesque armies. In addition to the "regular army" troops in the parade, there will be a band of real, wild Arabs. Election Returns Will Be Tuesday Evening Feature.

On Tuesday night there will be held no parade, but the general election returns will be flashed on a screen in front of a Houston newspaper in sight of the thousands of persons who are deeply interested in the presidential race. Returns in the election will begin coming in early Tuesday evening and will continue to come in until late in the night. If Tuesday's election counting is done as rapidly as former general election counting has been done, the approximate vote should be shown before the reports stop coming Tuesday night. This will be a feature of the week of fun and instruction which it is believed will appeal to thousands of citizens in Houston's nearby cities who will not receive the election returns until the following day unless they come to Houston to see them thrown upon a screen.

There will be a merchants' illuminated parade on Thursday evening.
