

TRIBUTE TO VETERANS' MEMORY ON JOHNSON'S ISLAND.

Daughters of Confederacy of Cintinnati, Ohio, Purchased Ceme-

tery in 1908.

Sandusky, O., June 8.-A monument o the memory of Confederate officers the Antarctic and soldiers buried on Johnston's to land, Sandusky Bay, Lake Eric, was dedicated today. The movement to erect the statue originated with the Robert Patron chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, of Civcinnati, O. The chapter purchased the cemetery in 1908 when it was found that the spot around which so many historic memories clustered, was being neglected and practically abandoned. Its only visitors were the veterans of a grand army post who every Decoration day held menorial services for their former foes.

The island lies in Sandusky Bar about three miles from the town of Sandusky and the post was known officially as "Depot Prisoners of Was. Johnson's Island, near Saudusk;

The greatest number of prisoners confined on the island at any one time was about 2000. This was just prior to the close of the war. All in all about 10,000 officers and soldiers were imprisoned there and 220 death were recorded. Fourteen of the dead were buried on the mainland.

When the first prisoners died M. Johnson gave his consent to their burial on the island and the cemetery was laid out under his personal direc tion. No lease on the land was ever executed and no compensation given for its uses Subsequently, at the close of the war, Mr Johnson, at his own expense, built a wire fence around the plot and kept it in repair for several years.
