THE JOHNSON LETTER IN FULL.

The Full Text of the Letter Written
by Cone Johnson to Sterling P.
Strong, Which is Often
Misquoted.

In view of the fact that a single
sentence from a letter written by
Cone Johnson is often quoted by
Judge Poindexter in his speeches to
prove that Johnson is still an anti-
prohibitionist, the full text of that
letter is here given. You can read it
for yourself and decide if the charge is
well founded.

The letter is full follows:
Tyler, Texas.—In 1887 I opposed
the constitutional amendment for
State prohibition. The ground of my
opposition was that the amend-
ment was too drastic and far-reaching;
that in undertaking to prohibit
the manufacture, the sale, the barter
and exchange of intoxicants, it went
too far, and to effect, at least, was
aimed not only at the traffic, but at
the prohibition of the traffic, but at
my views on the theory have not un-
dergone any great change; but twenty
years of observation and added ex-
perience, together with the workings
of local option, wherever adopted,
have made me much more tolerant
of prohibition laws. Twenty years
have also made marked changes in
the situation in Texas in public opin-
ion with reference to prohibition and
of the whisky traffic, and I am now
of the belief that the State of Texas
is ready for State prohibition, and
that conditions and public sentiment
are such that the proposed constitu-
tional amendment is both reasonable
and feasible, and certainly it is both
right and just, and as a step in the
right direction for the betterment of
the condition of this State.

Whisky is a bad habit, but the
world has outgrown it; it is a mere
excrescence, a wart on the body of
progress. It has no place in the af-
fairs of men; it is a relic of a
bygone age; it is a standing
menace to the welfare of society; a
constant danger to the public we-
fare; and the world, to my mind, is
now prepared to cast it out. It is
no place in business or in commerce;
it has had its day, and it is
now the time to bid it adieu.

The desolate homes which it has pro-
duced, the and eyes which are weary
with looking for the boy or husband
who is never to return, the uninter-
rupt disappointment of so many faith-
ful, heartbroken over the career of
prostituted sons; in a word, the trail
of weeping, anguish and grief which this
litter curse has left in its wake, I am
struck to give it even the counte-
enance of my indorsement or sup-
port.

The proposed method of dealing
with this subject by this constitution-
al amendment is not just the method
or manner in which I would deal with
it if it were left to me. I would
leave the right of local option as it
is, banish the saloon—the retail and
public drinking place, and try this
for a season at least. But the trou-
ble is that there are almost as many
methods of regulating it as there are
different methods of thought and we
will never get together. The saloon
is still with us, carrying with it a
large train of evil. Some of us would
like to abolish it. Some believe in
high license, some in local regulation,
and still others believe that if the
tax were taken off and the thing
made cheap and easy and a good
brand sold that would be best. And
so we go on fruitlessly. Has the time
not come, is there not enough
strength of character and public
spirit, is there not a willingness on
the part of good men to surrender to
this honest, "personal privilege," is
there not enough love of country and
solidarity for the youth which is
coming on after us, for as to the
one that has served its purpose, we
have outlived it and now it must go?
So believing and without bitterness
to those who may be engaged in the
business, and without taking differ-
ence with my views, I desire to go on
record now and at the ballot box not
only in favor of the submission of
this question to the people, but for
ever at enmity with the evil which
has done so much to blight the fair
world which God has given us.
