STRIKE LEADS TO VIOLENCE

MOB AT BROCKVILLE, ONT., ATTACKS DETECTIVES.

Door of Station Battered Down—Office Montreal, Can., July 23.—The police suffered.

Montreal, Can., July 23.—The police need of much heavier policing at important points on the Grand Trunk railway system took its place today in the list of crises, including arbitration and freight paralysis, discussed concerning the status of the strike inaugurated last Monday by the company's conductors and trainmen.

A more serious outbreak than has been previously reported occurred last night at the company's station at Brockville, Ont., and caused in increased activity at headquarters. Seven men were injured, none of them seriously, in the trouble, which followed the arrival of a local passenger train from Toronto. Stones were thrown and the agents' office window in it were six private detectives.

The door was battered down and the officers were driven out, kicked and battered.

The dispatcher's office was then attacked and the men inside expelled. Two of the injured were taken to the hospital.

WON THREE OUT OF FOUR

LOCAL Y. M. C. A. TEAM TAKES LAST GAME BY SCORE OF 4 TO 3

Proctor's Home Run Responsible For the Victory of the Home Team.

To Captain Proctor's big stick is due the victory yesterday afternoon in the last game of the series with the Lexington Canibals on the credit side of the local ledger, an entry, by the way, which shows that Greenville has taken three out of four from the chesty, East Texas champions. "Der Cap" not only tied the score with his home run in the sixth with two of the sacks tenanted, but it was he who raced across the pan in the ninth with the deciding count, when Francis let one get past him.

A casual glance at the score would lead to show that the Canibals should have had the game, but they had not the happy faculty of hitting when the need was, an accomplishment which the locals did possess for the time being.

The trouble started in the second when, with one hand laid away, McClary singled past third. Sandherr bounded one to Moore, who in trying to catch McClary at second, threw to center field. Both runners advanced when Sory threw White out at first. Moore had two strikes on Francis, but he dropped the next ball pitched with his eye, and the bases were full. Silver dropped a slow one between Dodd and Moore who did the Alphonse and Gaston stunt while McClary was dusting the pan. Willie fouled out to Dodd, and the agony was over for the time being.

Moore, first up for Greenville in the sixth, slammed one against the left field fence for two sacks. Dodd attempted to sacrifice, but both runners were safe when McClary dropped Oliver's throw. Cooper grounded to short, and Moore was thrown out at the plate. Willie's easy out, pitched to first, seemed to end the local's chance for a run in this inning. Proctor, however, put one of Oliver's shovels squarely, and the next moment the ball had disappeared from sight behind the left field fence, while Dodd, Cooper and Proctor waited around the sacks.

The Canibals came straight back for revenge and got it. After Francis had lifted one to Proctor, Oliver dropped one of Moore's slants with his anatomy. Willie drove the ball against the center field fence and the pitcher scored, Willie drawing up at second. Atkins flew to Witt, but Greenville swatted one against the fence in deep left, scoring Willie, although he himself was thrown out at second trying to stretch the hit.

The locals won the game in the ninth. Proctor took two bases when Oliver threw his slow one in front of the plate away. Buster drove one over Oliver's head and beat it out. Kerr was out, Tanner to McClary, Proctor being held at third. Then, with Neyland at bat, Francis let one get by him and the Greenville captain scored the deciding counter.

IT LOOKS LIKE COLQUITT

Johnson Appears To Be Taking Second Place

Incomplete Returns Indicate Davidson Lieutenant Governor, Submission Two to One.

FORT WORTH, JULY 24.—OUT OF COMPLETED RETURNS OF APPROXIMATELY 100,000 VOTES COLQUITT RECEIVES 40,000; JOHNSON 25,000; POINDEXTER 20,000; DAVIDSON 16,000. IT LOOKS LIKE THE RAILROAD COMMISSIONER IS NOMINATED BY 25,000 TO 30,000 PLURALITY. FROM INCOMPLETE RETURNS RECEIVED IT IS EVIDENT THAT COLQUITT'S MAJORITY CAN NOT BE OVERCOME.

OF RETURNS A. B. DAVIDSON IS RUNNING AWAY FROM THOMAS, HAWKINS AND WEBSTER AND WILL HAVE A SAFE PLURALITY. REPORTS FROM OVER THE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT INDICATE THAT RANDELL HAS A LARGE MAJORITY.

RETURNS INDICATE THE SUBMISSION HAS CARRIED BY TWO TO ONE. ONE PECULIARITY OF THE RETURNS IS THAT COUNTIES GIVING COLQUITT PLURALITY ALSO GIVE LARGE MAJORITY FOR SUBMISSION.

GIRL SAVES HIS LIFE

SPANISH PREMIER OWES ESCAPE TO YOUNG COUSIN.

Girl Sprang on Assassin Spelling Aim And Bullet Went Wide of Mark.

Barcelona, Spain, July 23.—Antonio Maura, leader of the conservative party and who, as premier, put down the execution of Dr. Francisco Ferrer, a year ago, owes his escape from death perhaps to the courage of a youthful girl cousin, who threw herself upon the assassin. It was shortly before last midnight that former prime minister stepped from a train at the Francia station, where he arrived from Madrid, en route to Palma. At his side was his cousin. Suddenly from the crowd a man, Manuel Posa, fired three shots. The first bullet pierced Maura's arm, and the second found lodgment in his leg. As Posa fired again, the woman sprang upon him, spelling his aim, and the bullet went wide.

Posa, who is about 18 years of age, said today he did not intend to shoot Maura, but he desired only to make a demonstration against him. The wounds inflicted are not regarded as serious.

INSURGENTS WIN BATTLE

AFTER TEN HOURS FIGHTING GARRIDA RETREATED.

Many Government Troops Killed and Hundred Pack Mules Captured.

Bluefields, Nicaragua, July 22.—Advices were received at the insurgent headquarters today from General Medina which state the latter's belief in the success of the revolution in the interior hinges upon the outcome of the fighting now in progress north of Acopoya, where an insurgent victory was reported yesterday.

General Moncada is now at Juigalpa at the head of 600 insurgents. Upon receipt of advices from the government forces, advancing upon him on either side, Moncada divided his forces, sending one column to engage General Chastilla, while with the other he led an attack against General Vasquez, commander in chief of the government forces, and General Garrida at Comedapa.

After ten hours fighting Garrida, with 500 men, retreated in disorder leaving many dead on the field. Moncada captured 200 rifles, a large amount of ammunition, and one hundred pack mules with camp equipment. Among the prisoners is Salvador Mantilla.

BONILLA TO BEGIN REVOLT

REPORTED HE WILL ATTEMPT TO OVERTHROW DAVILLA.

Steamer With Arms and Ammunition Sailed From Havana, Cuba.

New Orleans, July 23.—Special dispatches reached here last night (Friday) that Manuel Bonilla, former president of Honduras, left Havana with arms and ammunition, carrying men, arms and ammunition with the intention of overthrowing President Davilla of Honduras.

Advices from Port-au-Prince, Guadeloupe, say the government of Honduras has placed charges on all ships going to and from that country, and that it is impossible to learn anything concerning the progress of the reported uprising in several towns along the West coast of Honduras. The steamer, said to have been loaded with arms and ammunition, for Bonilla, is reported to have cleared from Havana, Tex., last week for Port-au-Prince.

STAINS NOT FROM BLOOD

CHEMIST SAYS IS COLORING MATTER IN A WATER SOLUTION.

Murder Theory in Rawn Case Is Weakened by Chemist's Report.

Chicago, July 23.—Stains on the cement sidewalk near the house of Ira G. Rawn, railroad president, who was found shot to death in his summer residence, were discarded today by the chemist to be caused by some coloring matter in a water solution, and not blood stains from the supposed murderer, as was believed by the state's attorney and friends.

This discovery weakens the theory of murder held by relatives of Rawn. Ira G. Rawn, a nephew of the deceased, has offered a reward of \$200 for the arrest and conviction of the party or parties who relatives believe killed him.
